**NDP, Liberals to nominate candidates**

Within a week all three parties in Halton riding will have

declared a candidate for the Oct. 30 federal election. Tonight (Wednesday) Halton NDP members meet in Milton to choose a candidate. A 24-year-old school teacher Mrs. Carolyn Holstein of Erin Township and a 51-year-old Oakville man Albert Terptrata will contest the candidacy.

The meeting will be held at the UAW Centre on Martin St. It is the second NDP nomination this term. Stephen Alcock was acclaimed several months ago but recently withdrew from the post. Terry O'Connor of Oakville won the Conservative nomination last spring and the Liberals are expected to give incumbent MP Rud Whiting the go-ahead at a Sept. 19 meeting at the Galaxy Club in Oakville. No one has announced intentions to contest Whiting's nomination and the meeting is likely to serve as a send-off for the Liberal campaign. Robert Andras, Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs will be the guest speaker at the Liberal kick-off.

Terptrata is the most recent individual to join the race. At 51, Terptrata sees physical conditioning and the lack of recreation facilities as major planks in his campaign.

**Approve permit**

A new form for application for building permits was approved by council. Its changes apply to buildings over the single family size.

Councillor Masales pointed out some problems had arisen with the building of apartments and council is trying to tie up the loose ends in advance. "We've got to be a little firmer," he said. The unit levy shouldn't be eaten up by servicing, with nothing left for bigger costs.

Heve, Oakes observed, "We don't want to get too rigid and stifled. People should be able to make changes in their own houses."

When need permit?  
Councillors went on to discuss exactly when a building permit is necessary.  
Deputy-reeve McKenzie, referring to the new houses in

Acton Meadows, pointed out panelling in the basement can be done by the builder at extra cost—and extra assessment. Does the man who panels a basement himself need a building permit?

Different answers  
Clerk-administrator Joe Hurst admitted there would be different answers to that, but the assessor would eventually discover the changes in a house.

Councillor Marks said his understanding is that a recreation room doesn't add to the value of a house, it just makes it easier to sell.

It adds living space, councillor Masales thought.  
Councillor Coats observed on the problem, that a kitchen in the basement of a residential zone certainly can't be ignored.
