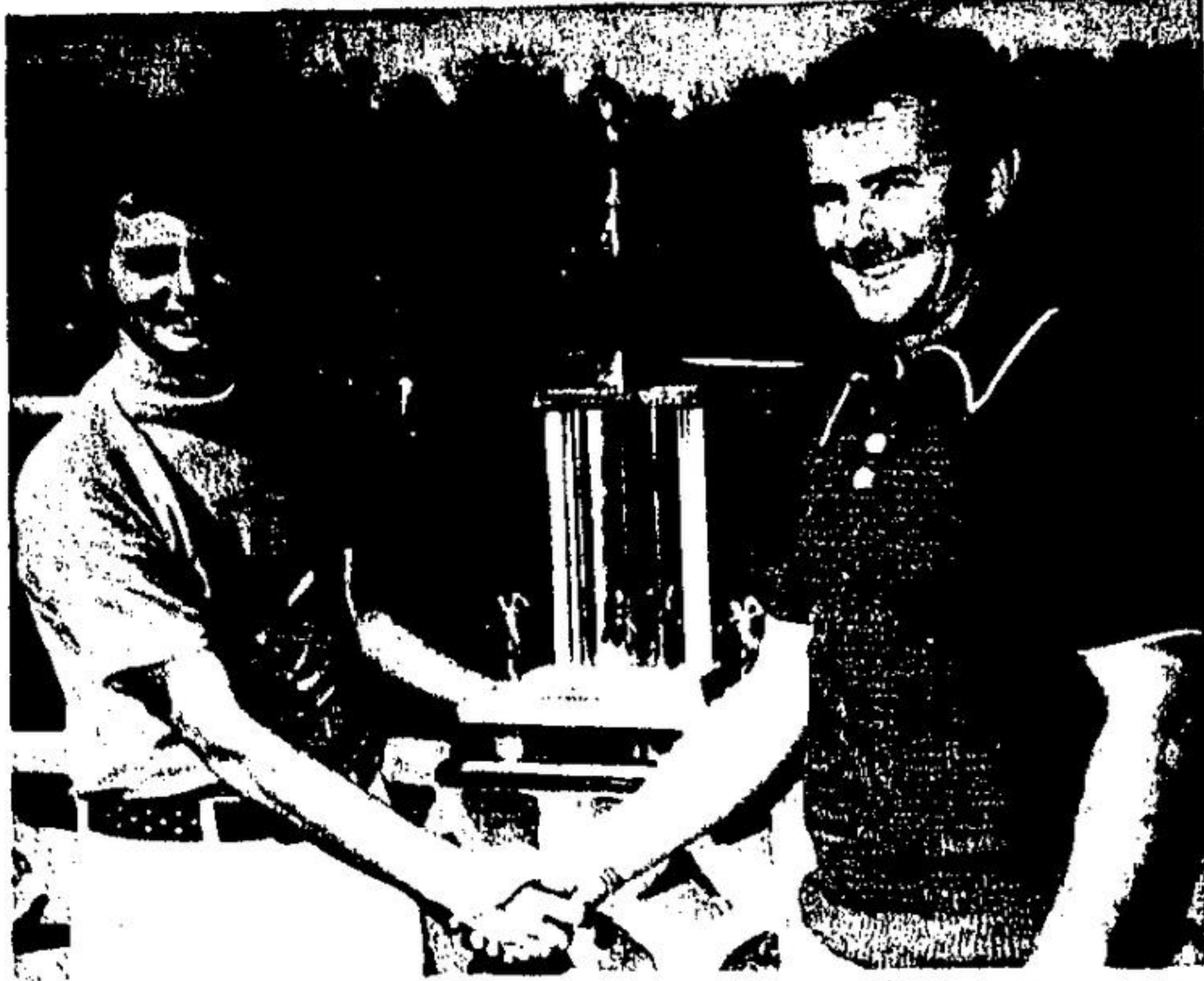
Fine second half play by the Astron gave them a 3-0 win over the Phantoms. Craig Somerville and Tony Rouse were the marksmen.

Rotarians lose series team officials cry foul

Acton Rotary novices blew a six goal lead and lost their Minor Oaks house league lacrosse total goals final series in overtime of the second game in Oakville Saturday morning.

Rotarians won the first game handily 10-4 in Oakville last Wednesday night and still had a five goal advantage heading into the final period of Saturday's game. Oakville scored five unanswered goals, plus one in overtime to capture the championship.

Many penalties, many of which Acton fans felt were unwarranted played a large role in the Rotarians defeat. Acton was given 10 of the game's 13 penalties. Todd McIntyre the league's leading scorer was

laminated five times. Acton officials were also critical of the Oakville team coach who chose to leave his best players on the floor most of the time, in spite of a league ruling which insists that all players receive equal floor time.

Acton coaches Mike Marcoux and Dave Cookley made a point to give all their players equal time, fearing they would be disqualified if they didn't.

"Maybe we should have won the series anyway, but I felt the officials just bent a little bit too far trying to help the Oakville team out," Marcoux commented after the game.

"Anyway our boys tried their best. They showed a big improvement in play over the year," he added.

Todd Cook and Derrick Neely scored the Acton goals in Saturday's game.

McIntyre fired five goals, Neely potted a pair and Cook, Mike Marshall and Pete Turkoz shot singles in the series opener. Assistants went to Marshall (3), Cook, McIntyre and Turkoz two each and Neely, John Toebes and Andrew Grant one apiece.

It was a sad ending to a fine season for coach Dave Cookley who left by air for a trip to Europe Saturday night.
