Council promises action on Sixth Line request

Esqueung Council has promised to ask the Department of Transportation and Communication to conduct a population density survey of the Sixth Line south of 22 Sideroad, after a deputation of eight householders headed by John Robson appeared at Monday night's council meeting.

The deputation asked council to consider lowering the speed limit to 30 m.p.h. on a portion of the road and to 20 m.p.h. in the immediate area of two bridges. They also asked for the installation of warning signs and guard rails.

the north and the McBride property on the south. A total of 44 school-aged children reside in the area, according to the brief.

Mr. Robson claimed the newly widened portion of the road at Lot 22 invites southbound vehicles to travel 60 m.p.h. or more.

The deputation also asked that snow fencing be erected in the area to stop drifting in the winter time and that sand boxes be installed at four locations. Mr. Robson reminded council a fully loaded school bus nearly slipped off icy roads there last winter.

said he was sure there are enough people in the area of the McBride farm to have the limit lowered.

Reeve Hill also said council will try to arrange another meeting with Transportation and Communication Minister Gordon Carton in an effort to obtain more roads subsidies.

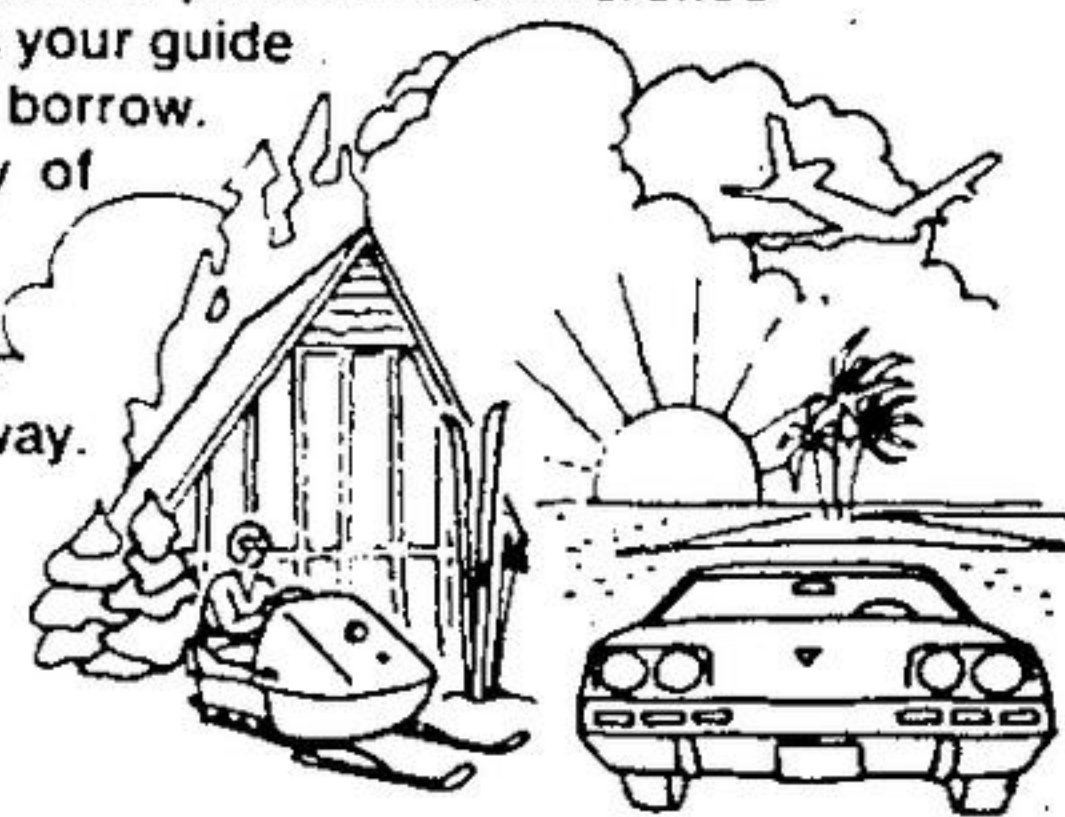

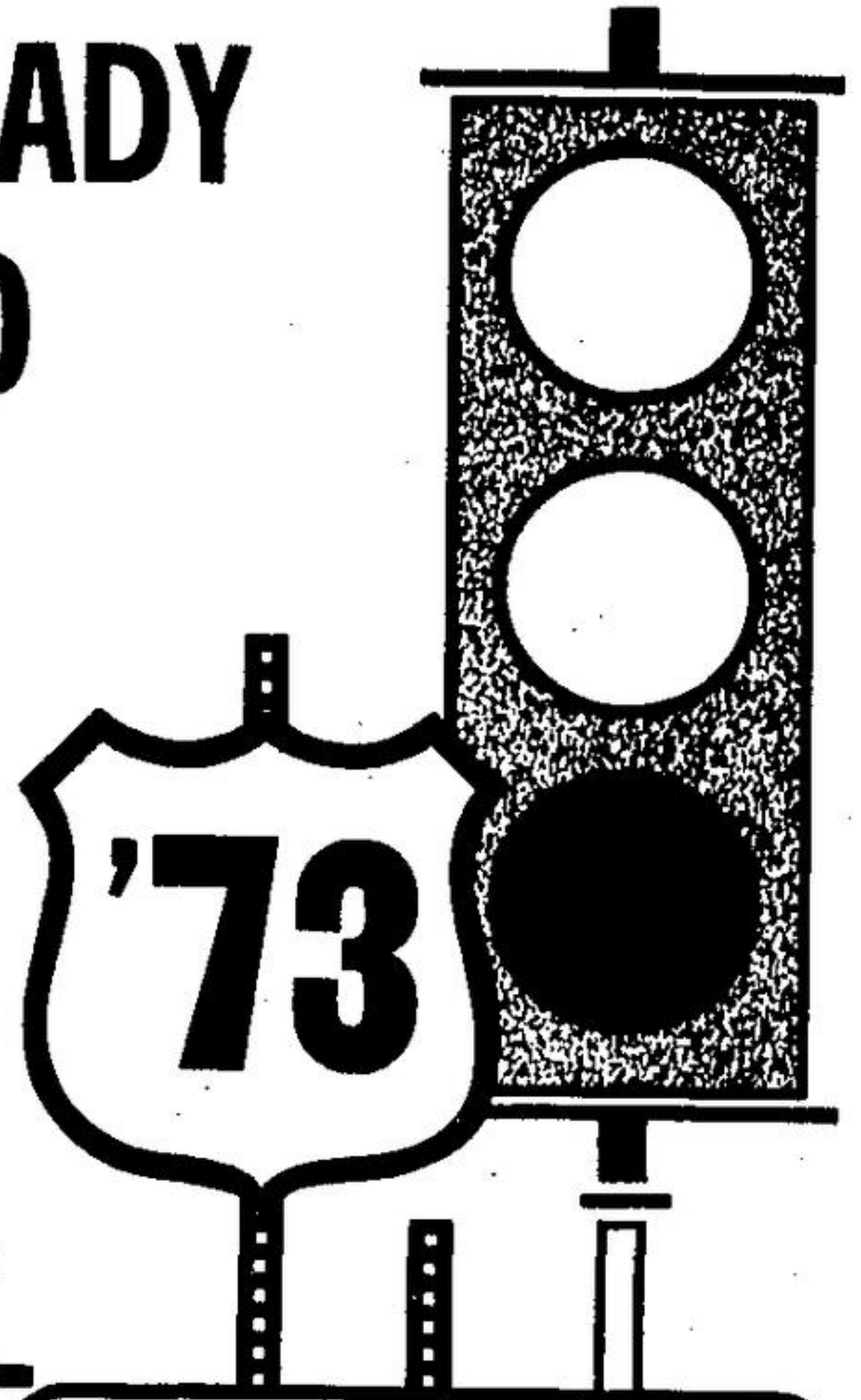
