Protect geraniums from heavy frost

 A heavy frost sometime during September is almost certain. By bringing your favorite geraniums indoors before it happens you can keep them for next year's garden.

Geraniums are easy plants to care for and can be overwintered in several ways. The whole plant can be dug up and stored over the winter in a cool dry room. However most homes do not have an area that is cool enough and plants tend to dry out completely making them useless for replanting next year.

The plants can be potted up and brought indoors as house plants. The geraniums should be in good condition. Remove any insects and gently hose down the foliage. Then pot them in a good soil mixture. Keep the plants slightly pot-bound for best results.

Geraniums make good house plants, but unless the plants are kept bushy, you may end up with unsightly "leggy" specimens. To develop a well-shaped compact plant start to pinch it back when the plant is about five inches high. Continue pinching out the growing tip until it has branched out sufficiently at the base.

Thousands write in for county passports

Halton Warden Jim Swanborough's office at the county buildings in Milton has been "swamped" with applications for the Passport to Halton program, according to the staff.

The Passport program is a three-weekend fall tour of 16 scenic and interesting attractions here in the county. Admission to each place is free and a "passport" booklet is being supplied to all applicants which will be stamped at each stop on the route. Officials predict it will take a family or group two full days to visit each of the 16 passport locations. The next

three weekends all spots on the tour will be open to the public Saturdays and Sundays, plus Monday Oct. 9 which is the Thanksgiving holiday. Officials report over 500 applications have been received to date—some asking for just a couple of passports, others asking for passports for groups of 50 to 100.

Passports to Halton — the passports which groups will carry while travelling through the county, will be in the mail tomorrow (Thursday).

Any groups which don't receive them may of course carry on and take the tours.
