O.P.P. report

Improper parking concerns officer

The week of October 1 to October 8, proved to be a quiet one for the officers of the Acton Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police. Officers investigated a total of 27 general occurrences and three motor vehicle collisions.
Of the general occurrences investigated, there were two missing persons, one report of malicious damage, one report of a prowler and one complaint of trespassing. The remainder of the occurrences ranged from found property to insecure premises.
There were four charges laid for violations of the Liquor Control Act.
Two drivers were arrested and charged for "Impaired Driving".
Accidents
Of the three motor vehicle collisions investigated, two were reported as "Hit and Runs". All three collisions resulted in minor property damage.
Acton detachment officers are concerned with the manner in which some local drivers park their vehicles. The town of Acton has by-laws restricting the manner in which vehicles are to be parked on town streets. One of the more common violations, is parking facing the wrong way. When on two way streets, vehicles are to be parked with the right wheels closest to the curb or right side of the road. Another common violation is parking so that the vehicle is too far from the curb or the untraveled portion of the road. Any vehicles found parked illegally, may be towed away at the owner's expense and or tagged for a parking violation. Make sure that your vehicle is parked properly.
