Bureau firefighters parade to Knox

About 40 firefighters from the fire departments of Milton, Acton, Oakville, Burlington and Georgetown marched to Knox Presbyterian Church in Acton on Sunday morning in a church parade culminating a busy "Fire Prevention Week".

The parade, held annually during Fire Prevention Week, is sponsored by Halton County Fire Prevention Bureau. Acton Firefighters were hosts this year—the parade is held in a different town each October. Acton Citizens Band led the

firefighters down Mill and Main Sts. to the Presbyterian Church, where they were welcomed by Rev. A. H. McKenzie and the congregation. Mr. McKenzie based his sermon on "The Role of Prevention in Life's Dangers".

Two horses shot Wynfield Farms

Horse owners in Esquesing, east of Georgetown, are concerned for the safety of their animals following the reported shooting of two horses on Roy Inson's Wynfield Farms.

Last week, Mr. Inson found one of his registered thoroughbred mares dead in the foaling shed. Closer examination showed she had been shot in the stomach with a 22 caliber weapon. She was in foal by an Arab Stallion.

On checking the other stock, the Insons found Charlie Buckskin Waggoner, the 28 year-

old gelding owned by Mr. Inson for 18 years, had been also shot in the chest. At last report, he wasn't able to hold his own and would likely have to be put down.

Charlie, the first Quarter Horse to be shown in Ontario, back in 1954, was a champion flag racer. He still holds the record as a champion barrel racer, and was never defeated in the quarter mile race, before retiring.

The horses were in the pasture when shot, and it is undecided whether it was a hunting accident or a case of malicious damage.
