Centre Dale Fisher, wingers Pete Morrison, George McPhail, Gary Turkozok and John Sheppard and defencemen Randy Weldon, Ted Harmer, Brian Davey and Brad Timbers are the returnees who have signed. Newcomers with the Sabres

this year will be winger John Snow of Ballinacud, who finished in the top 10 scorers in the Tri-County league with Georgetown juveniles last year and centre Bill McGilloway who was named to the all-star team at the Hespeler tournament as a member of the Acton C.F.A.W. midget club last year. Snow is in his final year of junior eligibility, but McGilloway will still have three years left after this one. Still trying for positions are defencemen Dave Lee, Gary Fisher and Ron Loutlet, forwards Mike Field, Bob Krul, Bob Inglis, Chuck Fendley, George Webkamigad and Barry Bigelow and goalie Rick Bonnette.

Webkamigad and Bigelow are Sheridan College students living in the Acton area. Sabre officials are trying to obtain releases from Georgetown juveniles for Inglis and Fendley. Need netminder Most pressing need for co-coaches Bill Dawkins and John Goy Jr. right now is goalkeeping help. Bonnette, a first year juvenile has looked good in practice, but the team will almost certainly need two netminders. If it can be arranged, Sabres may play a home and home exhibition series with the University of Guelph Gryphons sometime before their league

opener here, Sunday, November against the defending league champion Fergus "Green Machine". Sabres will play a return game in Fergus, Thursday, November 9. All players cut from the roster Monday night are either midget or juvenile age and can be considered good prospects for the future.
