A letter received by town council from Adams Knitting Mill was read at committee level, discussed and ordered filed.

Tuesday at the regular meeting councillor Chapman asked what the committee had learned from the letter.

Council had originally written Adams Knitting Mill following a report in the Toronto Star which indicated the Acton branch was closing due to a shortage of labor

Councillor Elliott explained the total blame couldn't be levelled on the shortage of labor, which council had doubted, Mr. Elliott said there were a vast number of things the owners didn't like about the town.
