

Want township case before the Minister

Nassagaweya Reeve Anne MacArthur and Deputy Reeve Don McMillan are attempting to meet with Charles McNaughton, Ontario's Minister of Inter-governmental Affairs, to voice their objections to Milton Council's brief recommending for a four-unit Halton.

Milton wants a four-unit regional governmental setup, while Halton's six other municipalities have agreed on a three-unit lower tier government. Both the County of Halton and Milton have sent opposing briefs to provincial authorities.

At a recent meeting of

Nassagaweya Council, it was agreed by Councillors a letter should be sent to the province objecting to what they felt were basic misconceptions in the Milton brief.

More impact

However at a regular Council meeting Monday, Reeve MacArthur suggested the letter might have more impact if she and Deputy Reeve McMillan could present it to McNaughton.

"Several people in Nassagaweya have contacted me and asked what we (Council) intend to do about Milton's brief," explained the Reeve.

The Reeve said she had recently met with Justice Secretary and Halton West MPP George Kerr, who had agreed to try to set up a meeting with McNaughton.

All will see it

Acting Clerk S. W. Savage reported Council's letter was about half completed. The Reeve suggested copies be mailed to all township councillors. "We want to have unanimous agreement on its contents," she pointed out.

It was agreed councillors would contact Savage if they had any objections or suggestions.

New clerk wants to be involved

A desire to become involved in a smaller community was the main reason Nassagaweya Township's new clerk-administrator Earl Cudde applied for the position. He was officially sworn in by Reeve Anne MacArthur during a Council meeting Monday night.

Cudde, 31, was hired by Nassagaweya Council to assume the position formerly held by Campbell Thompson. Recently Thompson resigned in order to become Milton's deputy-clerk, a newly created post.

Born in Ottawa, Cudde moved to Kitchener when he was a teenager. At 17 he started working in that city's assessment department - staying there for three years.

at Queen's University. A married man for two and a half years, he hopes to relocate in this area some time in the near future. The Cuddies have no children.

Variety of capacities

From Kitchener he moved to Whitby and worked in the municipal field for seven years in a variety of capacities. He was director of planning and was deputy clerk for one year. Last year he started a private construction business with a partner but decided to quit.

"Municipal life is something I love, and I wanted to become involved with a smaller community," he points out.

Cudde has undertaken several municipal correspondence courses including the Municipal Clerk and Treasurer Training Course, and the Assistant Practises and Principles courses

Credit coliform count points to pollution

Although a marked improvement has been noted in the tributary waters of the Black Creek, the quality of the water in the parent Credit River has been going steadily downhill for the past two years, a report from the Department of the Environment states.

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority received the report in

September. It is based on the coliform count in the river. Coliform bacteria, bred in the intestines of warm-blooded animals, are usually an indication of fecal pollution, either from man or livestock.

The report had no explanation for the increase in the coliform count but pointed the finger at the Georgetown water pollution

control plant as a possible contribution. It said better facilities are needed at Georgetown.

"We would hesitate to suggest that this one sewage treatment plant would have such a profound effect on a river the size of the Credit," the report states.

It is the downstream portion of the Credit which has deteriorated,

Newspaper comments sway council—trustees

Nassagaweya Council's decision to have a public plebiscite on the Ontario Jockey Club's request for Sunday night racing at Mohawk Raceway was influenced "through the media of paper comments."

This change was made by the trustees of the Police Village of Campbellville in a letter received by Council last week.

The trustees said they had passed a resolution in 1968 to

oppose Sunday racing and would continue to endorse the resolution.

Reeve Anne MacArthur questioned the "media comments" line. "I don't remember seeing anything in the paper," she said.

"There were some letters," noted Councillor Cal McIntyre.

"I don't think we should get involved in the pros and cons of

this matter. We've decided to take the question to the people," observed Deputy Reeve Don McMillan.

Council agreed to have the trustees' letter "received and filed."

Ten permits in October

Ten building permits were issued in Nassagaweya during the month of October, reports assistant building inspector Terry Gallamore. Value of building construction was \$140,000.

Permits were issued for one residential building, four residential additions, two garages, one commercial unit, one industrial unit and one

agricultural building. Total value of construction in the township for the year to date is \$1,751,500.
