





Contract negotiations bogged down several weeks ago but a last minute attempt to effect a settlement on management's ofter - a package worth 60 cents over the next two years -- was rejected by a 158-100 vote of union members Sunday.

Union organizers sald they plan to keep orderly picket lines. Office employees and supervisors reported to work Monday and encountered no problems crossing the picket line.




CALLING ALL VOTERS
