John Root marks 21 years as MPP

The Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario feted Mr. and Mrs. John Root and other Members of the Ontario Legislature at a "buffet supper on Wednesday, November 22, in recognition of Mr. Root's 21 years of continuous service representing Wellington-Dufferin in the Ontario Legislature.

In addition to representing the Riding, Mr. Root served for three years as Minister without Portfolio in Premier Frost's Cabinet, served over 10 years on the Ontario Water Resources Commission and was chairman of the commission at the time the staff was absorbed into the Ministry of the environment.

Mr. Root now serves as chairman of the Environmental Hearing Board.

There are only three other Members elected in 1951 still sitting in the Legislature: They are the Hon. James Allan (Haldimand-Norfolk), Hon. John Yaremko (Bellwoods, Toronto), and Ellis P. Morningstar, MPP Welland.
