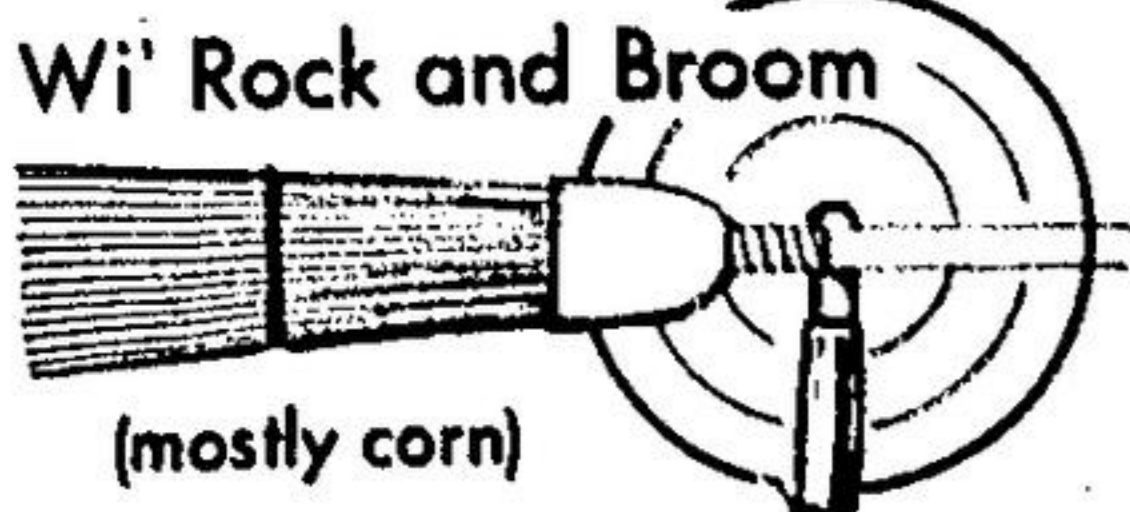

**Minor baseball assoc. needs more members**
