Acton arena gets Christmas gifts

Acton arena received its bag of Christmas gifts early this year, from Acton Parks and Recreation. The committee authorized several expenditures at its final meeting of the year Thursday night.

Among purchases authorized were new equipment for the building's washrooms at a cost of \$500, an edge-a-matic for the ice shaving machine at a cost of \$345, and new sound equipment at a cost not to exceed \$500, if new equipment is recommended by sound experts, who will be called in to study the building's needs.

Arena manager Harold Townsley asked that a new set of goal nets be purchased, so that they could be used for games only and the old ones used for practices. However, the board decided to shelve that item until next year.

Vice-chairman Barry Incoe pointed out the board had just spent \$177 on new mesh for the nets. Townsley argued that the board had the money this year and might as well purchase the nets this year as next.

Incoe suggested a local service club might be interested in donating a set to the arena sometime in the future.

ESQUESING COUNCIL BRIEFS

At the final regular meeting for 1972 Friday afternoon, Esquensing Council:

—Approved for payment the following items:
(a) \$2,200 year's salary to Reeve Tom Hill.
(b) the township's 1972 Halton County Board of Education levy in the amount of \$144,138.
(c) the township's 1972 County

of Halton levy in the amount of \$141,745.

(d) \$625.39 for new drapes for the council chambers.

(e) \$10,000, part payment of the township's Georgetown fire area levy.

(f) \$141.96 to clerk-treasurer Delmar French for mileage travelled on township business.
(g) \$140 each to Mrs. E. M. Markham, Mrs. Joan Lister and Mrs. Ruth Wilson for attending seven meetings of the township library board, \$120 to Mrs. Ruth Berry for attending six meetings, and \$100 to Reeve Tom Hill for attending five meetings.

(h) \$400 each to Deputy-Reeve Russell Miller and Councillors Len Cox and Wilfrid Leslie for attending 16 meetings of the Georgetown fire area committee.

(i) \$25 each to Reeve Tom Hill and Councillor Len Cox for attending one meeting of the Acton fire area committee.

(j) \$130 to Councillor Len Cox for attending 13 joint meetings of planning board and committee of adjustment, \$120 to Deputy Reeve Russell Miller for attending 12 meetings and \$100 to Councillor Wilfrid Leslie for attending 10 meetings.

(k) \$20 as a donation to the Georgetown Lions Club Christmas welfare fund.
(l) \$13,800 to the town of Acton for fire protection during 1972. \$9,000 will be recoverable from Erin and Nassagaweya townships which are also in the Acton fire area.

—Passed a by-law authorizing the township to raise \$50,000 to aid in the construction of drainage works under the 1971 Tile Drainage Act.

Reeve Tom Hill presided for the three hour meeting with all members of council present.
