Dairy farmers have also had to cope with some of the worst weather conditions in years. The poor quality of the winter feed reduces the milk yield, and to keep the public supplied farmers are forced to buy more of the expensive grain supplements and so are caught in a vicious circle that drives their costs still

Because of these circumstances, Mr. McLaughlin explained, dairy farmers had hoped for something better than the 35 cents decided upon by the Commission.

The 35 cent per hundredweight increase raises the farm price in Southern Ontario from \$7.05 to \$7.40 per hundredweight and in Northern Ontario from \$7.62 to \$7.97 per hundredweight.




NEW YEARS EVE IN SPAIN A gay New Years Eve celebration takes place in Puerta
