Likely scrap plans Silver Creek dam

The high level dam planned for the Silver Creek valley between Georgetown and Acton will likely never be built, according to Credit Valley Conservation Authority's flood and pollution control chairman Grant Clarkson.

The authority hopes to find other ways to maintain a steady flow of the small stream through summer months.

The Silver Creek site had been chosen as the location of the second dam to be built by the CVA. About 1,000 acres would be required to build the dam.

The dam would be deeper than the first one which was built at Georgetown, creating a reservoir there, and would take two and a half years to build.

Clarkson said Alternative systems, such as restoring original natural ecology, may be more effective and less costly, he added.

But Clarkson noted that the dam would also create a reservoir.

A 100-foot dam with a constant water level would create a reservoir that would be a small portion of the total cost of the dam. It could create an opportunity to create a park and a sports area in the area.

The dam would be in operation last Wednesday for the first time this year.
