The programs, held at Ontario School for the Deaf on Dec. 2 and at Stewarttown Senior Public School, Dec. 16, included a judging class and quizzes. Each girl displayed a record book, a recipe file and a plate of three types of vegetable relishes.

During the afternoon, each club presented a demonstration or exhibit for the visitors attending. Sterling silver spoons and certificates of achievement were given by Mrs. D. Bannister to those who satisfactorily completed the club unit.

Leaders recognized Provincial Honors pins and certificates were earned by Cindy Cordingley, Mary Fuchs, Susan Kidd, Barbara Le Riche, Ann McClure, Frances McLean and Gladys Smith, for completing 12 projects or six years of club work.

Recipients of County Honors (completion of six projects) were Joanne Brinke, Susan Bruce, Marion Jamieson, Betty June Laidlaw, Annette and Rika Vandevalk, and Jeany West-elaken. Two leaders, Mrs. T. N. Anderson of Limehouse and Mrs. W. Lasby of Rockwood, were recognized by the Canadian Council on 4-H Clubs for having led their local clubs for a period of five years.

Club members have selected the projects, "Sportswear from Knits" and "Accessories for the Bedroom" for the coming year. "Sportswear from Knits" is the next project for the Homemaking Club members. The training school for local leaders will be conducted Jan. 9 and 10 at Ligny Hall by County Home Economist Mrs. Doreen Bannister.

4-H Homemaking Clubs are open to all girls of 12 to 26 years of age. A club may be organized by a local leader and she will be assisted by a county leader. Clubs for four girls or more. New clubs and new members are welcome, and further details may be obtained from the Home Economist, at the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food, 3 Elizabeth Street South, Brampton.

Board has surplus

Halton County Board of Education will tuck a \$400,000 surplus away in a fund that could be used for a new administration building if and when they decide one is necessary. That lifts their reserve fund to \$1.7 million.

Bill Priestner, chairman of the finance committee said the board had the option of banking it in the fund or returning it to municipalities who could apply it against a mill rate increase at the municipal level. Priestner said that once regional government was decided, the board may need new facilities for administration and if they do, it would be better to draw on a reserve fund than to have to debenture for the funds.
