

# Sabres sink to sixth spot

Acton Sabres have dropped to sixth place in the South Central Junior "D" league standings, following weekend losses to Bradford Vaseys and Schomberg Cougars.

The league-leading Vaseys trounced Sabres 9-3 in front of a small crowd of 230 fans here Friday night. On Schomberg ice Sunday afternoon Sabres, playing without several regulars bowed 7-3.

Further complicating the sad Sabre situation is league convener Bill Church's award of two points to Schomberg for a game commitment the Acton club failed to keep December 21.

Although Sabres claimed they had reason for not showing up, namely the intense fog that existed that night, Church made the decision last week and the points appear in the Schomberg column for the first time this week.

### Good effort

Sabres put forth a good effort in Friday's game, but were simply overpowered by a better team.

Brad Timbers, Graham Fraser and George McPhail scored in the first period and Acton should have come out with the lead.

Instead, Bradford took advantage of two defensive lapses

and some shaky goaltending by Ted Hagan to score four times. Bradford added three more goals in the second period and two in the third.

Adrian Van Der Hulst paced the Vasey attack with three goals. Tom Coffey and Jeff Lefort potted two goals apiece and Les Kovacs and Bill Collins netted singles.

### Buzz-saw Bill

Strongest player on the ice for Acton was rookie centre Bill McGilloway, who set up two goals and was a veritable buzz-saw, as he skated forward, backwards and sideways to break up Bradford plays.

John Snow and Ted Harmer also earned single assists for the Sabres.

Referee Brian Peavoy of Georgetown handed out 17 penalties, nine of them to Bradford, including a major misconduct to defenceman Ed Jacques for swinging his stick.

Dale Fisher and Pete Morrison missed the game with the flu and Randy Weldon left the game early, suffering from the same bug.

Sabres play Alliston Hornets in Alliston Friday night and back here Sunday afternoon at 1.30.

A-Bs wind up their regular season with games in Fergus Thursday night and back here against Elora Sunday.

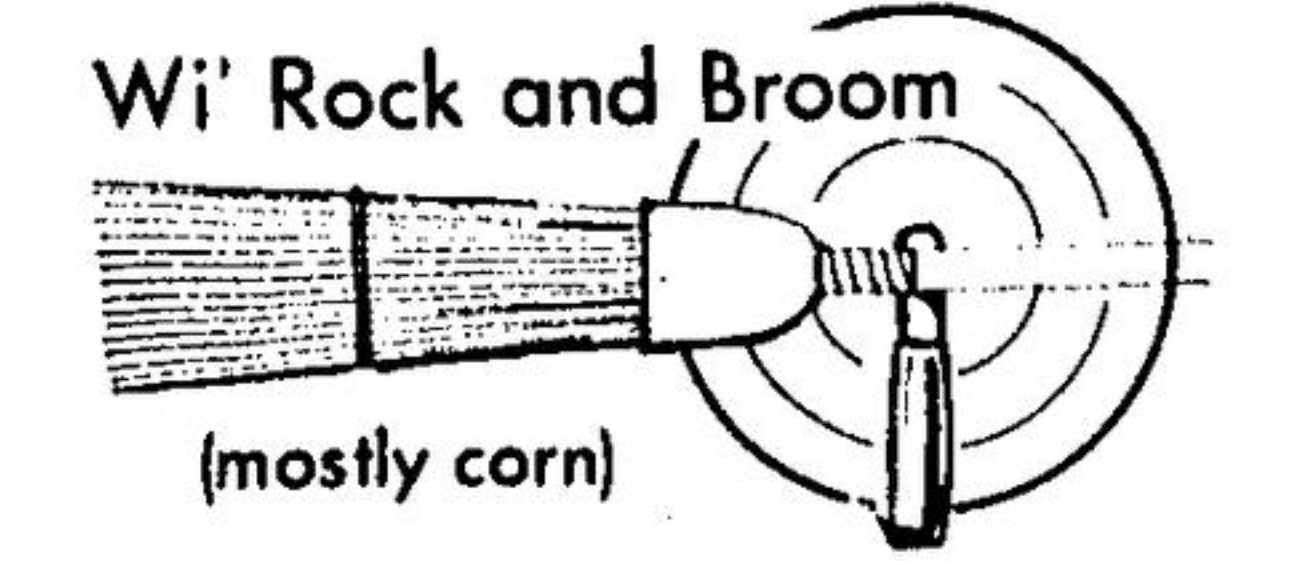
