





By now, you've probably received your new Postal Code. And you may have seen or heard ads telling people in big cities how accurate and complicated their codes are.

Well, your local code is not as complicated. Obviously, since fewer people live in your area, we don't need as many codes. In fact, all we need is one code to represent all the people in your town and on your rural route.

So, if you forget your code, just ask one of your neighbours. Then don't forget, send it to your friends. If they live in big cities, tell them

how complicated their life is.

Code by December 13th please call the Post Office at 868-1620. We'll mail it to you immediately. It is possible, however, that you are not in the Metropolitan Toronto Postal region, in which case your area may not have been coded yet. And please include the Post Office name when addressing letters to any of the following areas in Metropolitan Toronto:
