Resident of Canada since 1948 Michael Dyc of 336 Peel St. died in Guelph General Hospital on Feb. 9.

A good husband and father, Mr. Dyc is survived by his wife Sophia, sons Bohdan and Andrew of Acton. He was predeceased by three brothers.

Born in Ukraine Mr. Dyc was born in the Ukraine in 1916. During the second world war he served with the Polish combat infantry. He was captured by the Germans and spent the rest of the war in a prisoner-of-war camp. After the war he lived in Germany for a while and then came to Canada.

The family lived first at Thunder Bay and then moved to Acton where he built his own house on Peel St. He was a tanner by trade.

Let's talk about HORSES

with Jennifer Barr

A telephone caller has asked me to describe the different colors of horses and their terminology. As I don't seem to be very inspired today and my written problems are pretty much run-of-the-mill, it sounds like a good idea.
Bay is about the most common color one sees in this country, a brown body color ranging from a bright blood red to a coffee brown, but always with black mane and tail and lower legs. A bay can have white markings including socks but the leg from sock to hock (sounds like a rock song) is invariably black.
CHESTNUT is also brown, usually brighter, and with a light brown or sometimes flaxen mane and tail. The colour is different from a palomino in that the horse is a definite redhead, often with temperament to match.
BROWN covers the color spectrum from a beautiful seal brown to almost black. In fact the true black horse is rare. Most blacks are really dark brown and show this by having brown muzzles. In fact, a horse's true color can be seen at muzzle and eyes. Browns have black manes and tails.
BLACK is black (and beautiful). White markings are seen on all the above horses without affecting the color name unless the horse is covered with white splotches and becomes a Pinto.
PINTO this is a brown and white horse with definite areas of color. The PAINT is a black and white horse. Unless you're in the U.K. then the pinto becomes a squire and the paint becomes a piebald. Paints and pintos are also divided into Overos and Tobianos but if you have a pinto, just love him and forget about his name.
