A good husband and father, Mr. Dyc is survived by his wife Sophia, sons Bohdan and Andrew of Acton. He was predeceased by three brothers.

Born in Ukraine

Mr. Dyc was born in the Ukraine in 1916. During the second world war he served with the Polish combat infantry. He was captured by the Germans and spent the rest of the war in a prisoner-of-war camp. After the war he lived in Germany for a while and then came to Canada.

The family lived first at Thunder Bay and then moved to Acton where he built his own house on Peel St. He was a tenner by trade.

DUNS cover the buckskins, yellow with black mane and tail: brown, but always with balck mane and tail and lower legs. A grey duns, a mouse grey with black mone and tall; and red dun, a red with red mane and tail. A dun is obvious by the frequent sock to hock (sounds like a rock presense of dorsal striping and song) is invariably black. CHESTNUT is also brown, zebra marks on legs. The hair has colour beads on only one side of each hair which gives the dun it's distinct translucent quality.

APPALOOSA. This is a horse of any basic color with white spots, a white rump blanket, or white spots on it's quarters, or a white blanket with white spots, or ---. Get an Appaloosa book if you wish to know all the many color variations that make up an Appaloosa.
