Mobile home

Mobile home permits may become more valuable in Esquesing township than homes and the township council is concerned about the possibility. The township passed a by-law in 1967 saying there would be no more mobile homes allowed in Esquesing, but now a difference of opinion has arisen between members of council about what

the "no more" meant. Wallace Thornson, who has lived in a mobile home on Lot 1, Con. 7, near Hornby since 1961 told council Monday night he has sold his home and will be moving out of the township. He offered to advertise for sale his mobile home permit, which he claims is still valid for the rest of 1973. Mr. Thomson said he has renewed his permit every year.

Deputy-reeve Len Coxe expressed the opinion the intent of the 1967 by-law was to license mobile homes that were in the township at that time, but he added he thought the permit should become void, if the home was moved out of the township.

"Well I have a different view and here's the reason," Reeve Hill replied. "Here's a man who's honest enough to come to this council and yet there are 11 of these things up at Prucyks and we're not getting a dollar a month out of any of them. Councillor Howitt said the only question about the Prucyk situation is whether or not the people are living in the homes year round.

of the traffic on Highway 401 and other area roads. The present crusher will be replaced by a gyratory crusher and increase the capacity from 1,000 tons per hour to 1,500 tons

per hour. A new road has been constructed to provide access to the new plant. Certain areas along the road have been supported by gabion stone baskets. The new winding road will make the path up the escarpment attractive and McCombe notes it will look better when more grass and trees are planted.

Shut old plant down

According to the schedule, this fall the old plant will be shut down and dismantled and at the same time the new plant will swing into production, providing continuous service customers.

The new plant will occupy about 65 acres of the 1,200 acres of land the firm holds in that area. While plans for landscaping aren't final yet, they will be implemented by the spring of 1974, says McCombe.


