In 1933 he purchased the Luke Burial Co. which later became the McIntosh-Anderson Funeral Home. He retired from business in May 1968 when he sold the business to the present owner, Donald G. Spiers.

He was a charter member of Knox Presbyterian Church, Oshawa, trustee of that church and a former board member.

He received his 60th year Past Master's Jewel from Temple Lodge in 1971. He was a charter member of Parkwood Lodge AF & AM 695, Oshawa; member Toronto Lodge of Perfection and Rose Croix. Toronto; and Moore Consistory, Hamilton. He received his 33rd degree Scottish Rite (Honorary) in October 1954. He was a member Pentalpha Chapter Archmasons of Oshawa and of Corinthian Lodge 100F and the Encampment.

He is a former member of the Oshawa Rotary Club, the Oshawa Lawn Bowling Club, Oshawa Curling Club and the Oshawa Golf Club.

He is survived by his daughterin-law Mrs. Grant McIntosh (Ruth) his grandson Roger both of Oshawa and a cousin Mrs. George Decoff (Betty) of Toronto.

He was predeceased by his son Grant in 1966, his wife, the former Rachel Morton whom he married in Acton, Ontario in 1909, who died in 1967 and by his brother

Frank McIntosh of Acton. The funeral was held from the McIntosh-Anderson Funeral Home on Tuesday March 6.


