## C. Roy McIntosh was funeral director

C. Roy McIntosh, retired funeral director, died at his home 255 Simcoe St. N., Oshawa, on Sunday morning, March 4. Born in Stewarttown, Jan. 7, 1881, he was a son of the late James and Hannah McIntosh. He was educated in Acton public school and Georgetown high school. He started his business career as a bookkeeper, with Beardmore and Company in Acton.

In 1908 as an Acton town councillor he was a member of a delegation from across the province to meet with the then premier of Ontario, W.J. Whitney, to petition the government to establish a central hydro system. The Ontario Hydro Commission was later established as a result of those meetings.

**Funeral home**  
From 1912 to 1920 he was employed by Tudhope Manufacturers (manufacturers of carriages) in Orillia. While in Orillia he was active in church work, sports and lodge activities. He moved to Oshawa in 1920 and from 1920 to 1933 he was superintendent of the Small Parts Enamel Dept. of General Motors. In 1933 he purchased the Luke Burial Co. which later became the McIntosh-Anderson Funeral Home. He retired from business in May 1968 when he sold the business to the present owner, Donald G. Spiers.

He was a charter member of Knox Presbyterian Church, Oshawa, trustee of that church and a former board member.

**Walker past master**  
He was Past Master of Walker Masonic Lodge, Acton; charter member and 1st Worshipful Master of Temple Masonic Lodge, 648, Oshawa. He received his 60th year Past Master's Jewel from Temple Lodge in 1971. He was a charter member of Parkwood Lodge AF & AM 695, Oshawa; member Toronto Lodge of Perfection and Rose Croix, Toronto; and Moore Consistory, Hamilton. He received his 33rd degree Scottish Rite (Honorary) in October 1954. He was a member Pentalpha Chapter Archons of Oshawa and of Corinthian Lodge 100F and the Encampment.

He is a former member of the Oshawa Rotary Club, the Oshawa Lawn Bowling Club, Oshawa Curling Club and the Oshawa Golf Club.

He is survived by his daughter-in-law Mrs. Grant McIntosh (Ruth) his grandson Roger both of Oshawa and a cousin Mrs. George Decoff (Betty) of Toronto.

He was predeceased by his son Grant in 1968, his wife, the former Rachel Morton whom he married in Acton, Ontario in 1909, who died in 1967 and by his brother Frank McIntosh of Acton.

The funeral was held from the McIntosh-Anderson Funeral Home on Tuesday March 6.

Interment was in Oshawa Union Cemetery.

Mary Alice (Mae) Lindsay died in Toronto Western Hospital on February 20.

Eldest daughter of the late Ninian Flockhart and Jane Alice Lindsay she was born at Evergreen Holme, highway No. 7, just east of Acton, where she resided for her lifetime until she moved to Toronto, after living

with her brother Ninian for many years on the homestead.

She is survived by Ninian G. of Acton and Jean C., Anna A. and Dr. James C. Lindsay, Toronto.

Mae had been a patient at Mapleview Lodge, Acton and Guelph General Hospital. During the last year while making her

home with her sisters in Toronto she was in a nursing home and was also a patient several times in the Toronto Western Hospital, where she passed away.

She attended Bannockburn and Acton Schools and later took a course at Macdonald Hall, Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph. She has also been a

member of the Bannockburn Institute.

She was a member of the Acton Trinity United Church. In her earlier years she was a regular member of the Young People's organization and Sunday School.
