

Angus reports seeing tigers, hippos, elephants, lions, seven foot gerenuks, and, on one trip over the Serengiti Plains he and his party in their land rover were completely surrounded by 70,000 wild beasts and 70,000 zebras. He tells of moving through lion country where the animals completely ignored their presence partly because they couldn't pick up their scent in the gasolino imprognated vehicle. Hyenas, jackals, vultures, and Angus actually saw lions kill two cape buffalos.

On one of their flight trips they were escorted by a professional game hunter who guided them through a special shooting reserve. Pictures? Angus says he's no camera bug but he has over 200 terrific wildlife shots taken on an ordinary Instamatic with pictures of exciting places and highlights of his trip.
