Halton educators

members. The meeting Thursday was the third of that subject and it dealt with the most controversial issues. For each of the meetings over 100 teachers packed the board room to watch and listen to the proceedings.

Split vote
Trustees voted 12-8 in favor of reorganizing the headship system. Several trustees noted the appointments sometimes had been used to attract staff members and as a form of merit pay.

While most agreed the headship system was outdated, some felt those who had been appointed to positions of responsibility shouldn't have their salaries cut.

An amendment to that effect by Georgetown Trustee Ernie Bodnar was defeated, however. Singleton suggested that because a person was appointed to a headship didn't mean he would still hold that position 20 years later.

Singleton said that unlike the headship system, where a head must have received a specialist degree in his subject area to be considered for the appointment, a chairman won't necessarily be a specialist. There will be more emphasis on leadership and less on credentials, he suggested.

Burlington trustee Fred Armitage noted only one third of the teachers have sufficient academic standing to qualify for appointments under the headship system now. He indicated many good leaders were being overlooked because they lacked certain credentials.

Allowances under the old system would provide an additional \$2,000 for a head, \$1,150 for a minor head and \$1,000 for an assistant head.

The move towards differentiated staffing and acceptance of paraprofessionals is one that was contested by the elementary teachers. Teachers feared that in a time when surplus teachers exist, it could be possible that certified teachers would take jobs as paraprofessionals at a lower pay scale than what they deserve.
