Theatrical Craft and Design becomes one-year option

Theatrical Crafts and Design at Sheridan will be given as a one-year option in the Fashion, Technique and Design program, this September. Fashion students have been taught to apply their skills to costume designed especially for theatre. Under the expertise of a professional theatrical designer, students have produced garments and properties for many dramatic productions; for example Brock University, Spring 1971, *The Importance of Being Earnest*.

This year students will become more deeply exposed to, and will master many of the theatrical crafts. Instruction in draping on the dress form, sketching and the design of textiles and head gear will be studied. Theatrical properties will be made. Exposure to set design, costume development and the effects of lighting on both colour and fabric will also be offered. Graduates of the course will be useful additions as theatrical craftsmen to any large or small theatrical group.

Candidates for the course must have successfully completed at least one year of study in drama, art or fashion at a post-secondary institution. Applicants should also have motivation and design ability.

First year Art Education offered during summer

First year Art Education courses will be offered for the first time during the summer at Sheridan College.

Art Education is a three year degree/diploma program given co-operatively by Sheridan College and Erindale College (University of Toronto). Students take academic programs in the morning at Erindale and study art subjects in the afternoon at Sheridan.

The summer session should appeal to teachers who are working on their degree or to persons interested in upgrading their qualifications. Courses may be taken for credit or non-credit.

Students choose between drawing and painting I or photography in the morning, and animation or design I in the afternoon. A half credit is given for each completed course; students may take a maximum of two courses.

Courses will run every day for six weeks starting July 3 at the Sheridan College, Oakville campus. Morning classes are from 9 to 12; afternoon classes from 1 to 4 p.m. Classes end Aug. 10 after which date instructors may arrange for assessment or exams.

To qualify, candidates must meet University of Toronto admission standards and pay the university fees of \$57.50 for each half credit course. Applicants will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Enrollment will be limited to 25 students.
