Acton Rams sporting 13 new faces in their lineup started off the 1973 Junior "C" lacrosse season in fine style, dumping the newly-formed Orillia Lions 9-6 at the community centre Monday night.

Rookies accounted for four of the Ram goals, while Bruce Cooksley and Craig Weldon a pair of high-scoring returnees contributed the other five Acton.

Cooksley, who dazzled the visitors with his fancy stick-handling and sharpshooting bagged a hat trick. Weldon added a pair of goals and assisted on three more.

George Artem, a graduate of the Rotary midget club potted a pair of goals. Another average midget Rick "Woody" Newman and Glen McKenzie were the other Acton markers.

Billmores this season paced the Orillia scoring attack with two goals. Singles went to Mike Daikoff, Stan Gross, Tom Woodrow and Dave Stanga.

Orillia grabbed a 2-1 lead in the first period, but Rams recovered, outscoring the visitors 4-2 in each of the final two frames.

Adding additional offensive power to the Ram attack was goalie Gary Turkosz who led several rushes up the floor and finished the evening with three assists.

The move backfired once in the second period when Turkosz was checked at centre and Holder fired a 90 footer into the unprotected Ram cage.

Orillia served 21 of the game's 48 penalties.

Coach Dwyer was pleased with the performance his relatively young squad gave in their first outing.
