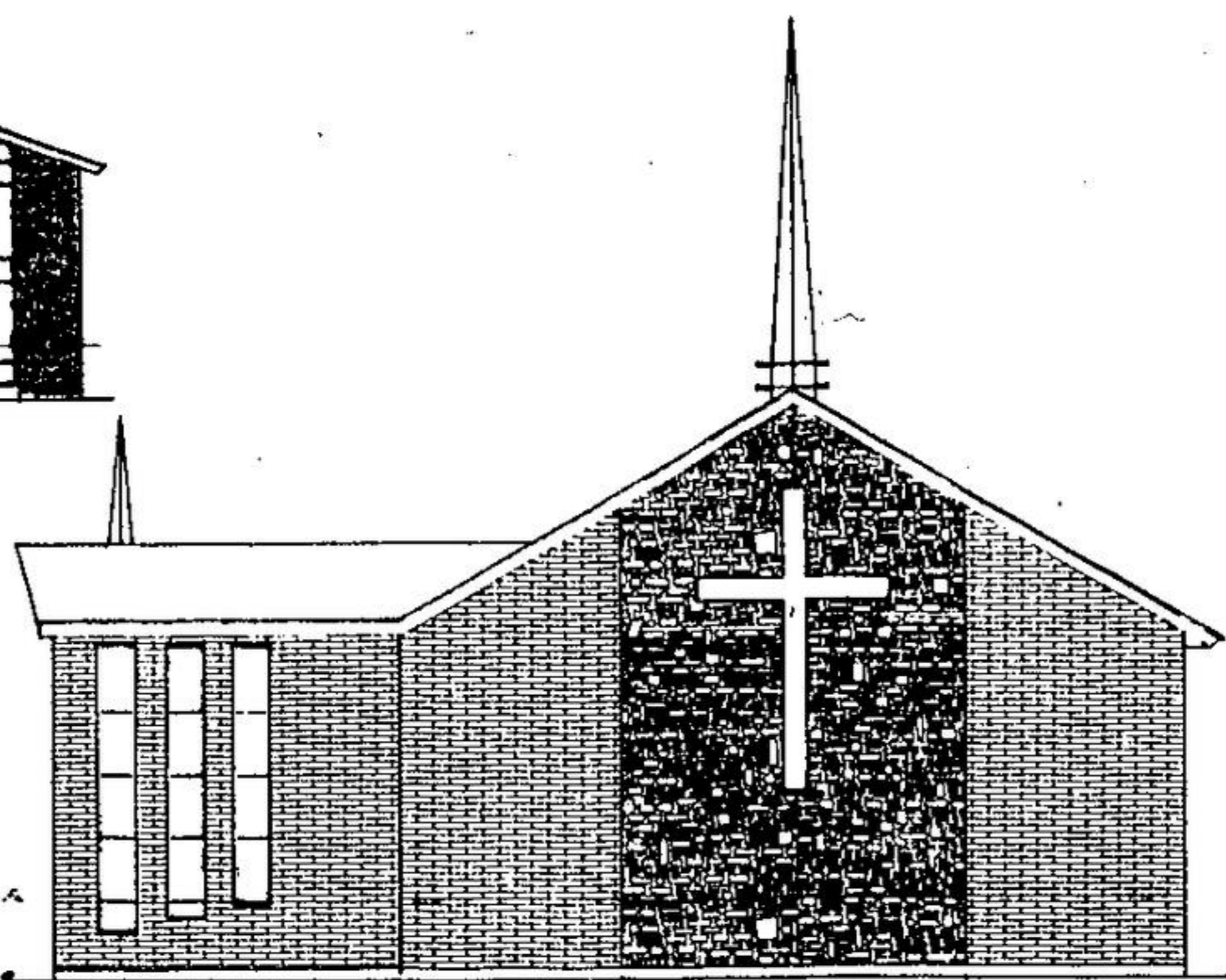


Architect's view of new church

ADDITION TO Evangel Pentecostal Tabernacle will completely change the appearance of the front of the church. The project will include enlarged vestibule and auditorium and five extra Sunday School classrooms. The work will begin very soon and is expected to be finished by the end of July. K. and K. R. Schmuki are contractors. The growing congregation was established in Acton about 19 years ago.



Growing congregation, S.S. require addition at Evangel

Evangel Tabernacle, 33 Churchill Rd. N., will take on a completely new appearance soon as the growing congregation undertakes a \$30,000 building program. The addition will enlarge the present vestibule to 62 by 16 feet extending to the north parallel to the church front. The main auditorium will also be enlarged with extra seating capacity and choir platform. The lower part of the addition will provide Sunday School accommodation of five extra classrooms, each about 11 by 22 feet with 40 foot corridor.

End of July K. and K.R. Schmuki will begin construction in the near future, and it's expected they will be finished by the end of July. The new front exterior design will include Angel Stone decor set

in white stucco with typical church spires and lighted cross. This is the second addition to the church. The congregation was established here 18 or 19 years ago and the original building erected about 15 years ago. The first addition, about five years ago, was filled as soon as it was built, explained the Rev. S. Thoman.

Particular needs now are Sunday School accommodation, a larger foyer and addition to the main auditorium.

Mr. Thoman explains there are between 180 and 190 children attending Sunday School there now. A bus has been picking up children in the district. Beginning this Sunday another bus will pick up children in town, previously brought by car.

This service has been in operation for about nine years now.

Request equal hydro payments

A request from five hydro users in the Kington Hill homes subdivision that they be allowed to make payments in 12 equal installments over the year met with mixed reaction at Thursday night's Acton Hydro Commission meeting.

Commissioner Ted Tyler Sr. wondered how such a system would work when it is not known how much each householder is going to consume.

Commissioner Orville Brown said a similar system is used with heating oil companies. Twelve equal payments are made by consumers. If at the end of the year the consumer has overpaid, he receives a refund. If he has underpaid, he is mailed a 13th bill.

Mayor Les Duby suggested the commission check with the

Hydro Commissions in Georgetown and Milton to see if the equal payment system is being used in those towns.

Secretary Audrey Urquhart said she had been told the system is used in Mississauga.

"Yes but hydro is a lot higher down there," replied Commissioner Tyler.
