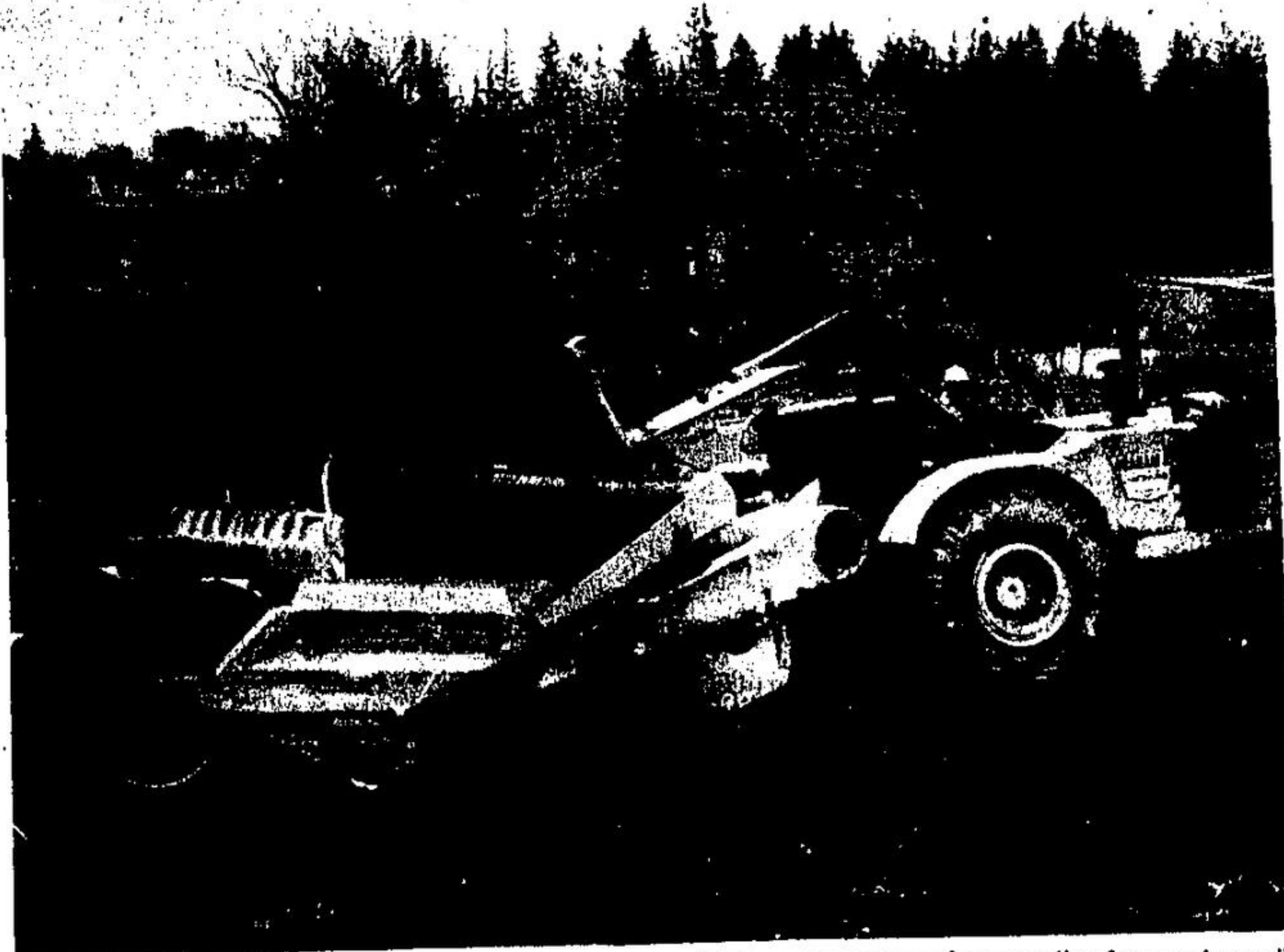
**From N.Z.**

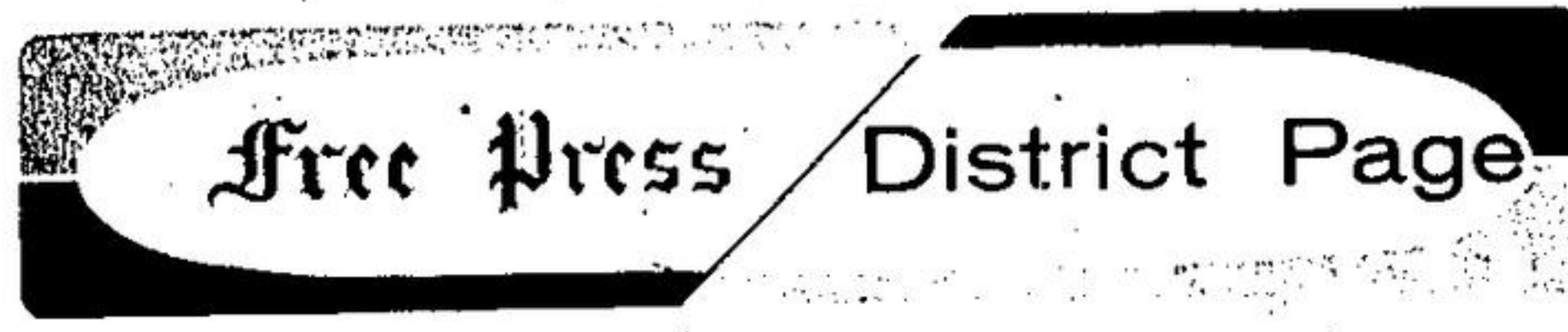
**Lunch** was served by Mrs. Leo Jamieson and Mrs. Bob Pinkerton with the hostess.

## Teachers vote on paid president

Haltos Chapter of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation may have a president who will be working half time as a school room teacher and half time as a Federation President.

Haltos County Board of Education agreed to the arrangement and indicated candidates would have to make arrangements with their principal so they can have enough time off for the job.
