A grand jury which toured the county jail, court house and administration buildings in Milton last week found little wrong with the facilities, but queried the state of two prisoners with complaints.

Two fires

Acton firefighters were called to the home of Mr. E. Jollymore, 72 Rockwood, late Wednesday night after Mr. Jollymore's dog alerted him to a garage fire.

The double frame garage and its contents, including car, snowmobile and numerous tools were destroyed. Damage is estimated between \$5,000 and \$6,000. There were no injuries.

Acton Fire Chief Mick Holmes said the cause of the blaze is undetermined.

The Jollymore home is situated on the Fifth Line, Nassagaweya, above 20 Sideroad.
