Red-hot goaltending by diminutive Doug Taylor of the visitors and loose defensive work at times by the Acton Rams helped East York Mohawks chalk up their first win of the current Junior "C" lacrosse season against Acton 12-10 on a sticky night at the community centre Monday.

East York had previously beaten only Midland twice.

Rams now have a record of five wins and three losses, as they head into their next game in Midland tomorrow (Thursday) night.

The game was scoreless until the 9:50 mark of the first period when Bruce Green broke the ice, scoring for East York. Two more Mohawk goals and a pair of Rams tallies, one by Dave Manes and the other by Bruce Cooksey with

only three seconds left in the period made the score 3-2 at the end of the first period.

Knots count

Craig Weldon knotted the count after only 33 seconds of play in the second frame. East York then bounced back to make an 8-6 lead, beating Ram goalie Gary Turkosz on a pair of underhanded screen shots from well out. Rick Newman with a pair of good efforts and newcomer, Dave Hill making his first start ever in a Ram uniform also scored for Acton in the second period. Hill, a genuine hustler played last year with the Hamilton Junior "B" team.

Rams attempted to close the gap in the third period, but each time either Acton passes were lacking or errant or Taylor was there to bar the door to the East York cage. There was no scoring

after the 14:54 mark.

Statisticians counted a total of 81 shots fired at the East York net.

Ram fans had their chance to howl on one occasion when Taylor came out of the net, had his attempted pass knocked down by Bruce Cooksey and Hill picked up the loose ball and waltzed in to deposit it in the empty Mohawk net.

The light Ram defence was unable to cope with the bigger East York players who often battled their way past two and three defenders.

Brian Green and John Sutton netted three goals apiece for East York. Al McMinn and Keith Tsurda had two each and Jim Chisholm and Ted Hall one each for the Mohawks.

Dave Hill and Bruce Cooksey bagged hat tricks for the Rams. Rick Newman had a pair of goals and singles went to Craig Weldon, Dave Manes, Glen McKenzie and Terry Dunn. Weldon, McKenzie and goalie Turkosz all earned two assists.
