Start fourth phase arena reinforcing

Phase four of the Acton arena reconstruction program which will strengthen the north and south walls and the sides of the building, got underway Monday when Dalton Engineering work men began taking down the north wall.

The north side of the building will then be shored up, as will the roof. The program also calls for installation of a new cement block wall up to the roof on both the north and south sides and for the north side only, new concrete

footings and posts, new grade beams, cleaning and painting of the bases of steel columns and installation of weeping tile to help drainage.

Also slated for the north wall are installation of a new overhead door towards the back of the building and construction of a fire exit and new precast steps in the middle. The south wall has already been shored up and had a fire exit and precast steps installed.

Foreman for the job, Harry

Park said the reconstruction will not interfere with any arena activities. He estimates the job will be completed by September.

Previous work Dalton Engineering has already completed the first three phases of the reconstruction program which began in 1970. They included shoring up and reinforcing of the south wall, cement blocking of the east wall and installation of cross-bracing to reinforce the west wall against the danger of high winds.

Beat Waterdown

Coming off two straight losses Campbellville pounded out an 11-7 win over Waterdown Sunday afternoon in Campbellville. It was a very loosely played game in which a total of 11 errors were committed and only three of the 18 runs were earned.

Wayne Emma, making only his second start of the season went eight innings for Campbellville and was the winner.
