

Rams top East York for eleventh win

Displaying plenty of confidence and finesse around the opposition net, Acton Rams wound up the regular tier 2 Junior "C" lacrosse season on a winning note, as they thumped East York Mohawks 16-9 at the community centre Monday night. The same two teams begin a best of seven league semi-final series at Leaside arena in Toronto tonight (Wednesday).

The scoring heroics of Dave Hill and Bruce Cooksley and steady goaltending by Jim McNabb carried Rams to their 11th victory in 18 games. Hill fired five goals and

assisted on four others, while Cooksley the club's leading scorer contributed four goals and three assists. Rams built up a 5-1 lead in the first period and were ahead 10-4 when Mohawks lifted their starting goalie and installed Dave Taylor, a pint-sized rubber stopper who has been stingy with Rams shooters all year. The third period turned out to be a 5-3 standoff.

throwing his stick. Scott made a slick deke on the penalty shot, but Taylor failed to go for it and picked the ball out of mid-air. McNabb, who has been the
