Purchase another 119 acres for new conservation area

Another 119 acres has been added to the land bank for the new Silver Creek Conservation area.

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority announced that approval has been received from the Minister of Natural Resources for a grant of \$119,000 which will pay for 75 per cent of the total cost of the 119 acres adjoining the area. The Nature Conservancy of Canada has also given the Authority a grant of \$38,750 toward the purchase of this Niagara Escarpment land, comprising the Wagner and Muldoon properties in Esqueving township.

The purchase will make a total 703 acres of Authority-owned escarpment land in the immediate area which will eventually be developed as a multiple
