The horse that is ridden too early tends to suffer from leg strain and consequent breakdown in later years. Even if this doesn't happen, he usually rebels at age three or four and becomes an argumentative monster, merely because he wasn't mature enough before schooling began. Incidentally, a horse isn't considered grown up until four

Anyone for a horse sit-in?




