Georgetown Little Theatre is preparing for what promises to be its biggest season yet with a lineup of four plays, (three comedies and a children's Christmas play).
Preparations for the first two are already under way.
The group is in the throes of altering some plans for an unexpected but nevertheless pleasant reason. A grant of \$600 has been awarded them as a "Theatre Ontario Training Grant," under the auspices of the Ontario Arts Council. The funds are to be used to hire a professional director for one of the coming season's productions.
G. L. T. is at present working through the facilities of the Central Ontario Drama League to recruit a director. Apart from taking satisfaction in recognition that warrants such a grant, members are looking forward to the challenge of working with someone of professional expertise and discipline.
The director hired will also run a number of workshops and other educational functions so that all aspects of the Little Theatre work can be expected to show more professional polish.
Like many community groups, this one has earned a following in the area which makes up an enthusiasm and dedication what it lacks in size. There is always a degree of continuity provided by the "old hands" who are seen both on stage and back stage year after year. The problem at present is for these old hands to convince the interested public that it is not (as it may appear), a closed group.
Few of the members have had any form of professional theatrical training and most were coerced into joining to lend their skills they have to help out with a given play. Almost inevitably they stay on to find a rewarding and fun-filled recreational activity.
As the levels of skills advance it naturally follows a group decides to attempt more ambitious productions, both in the artistic sense scope of the productions, both in the artistic sense, scope of the production and numbers of people involved. Here is where the source of community theatre is in real danger.
If G.L.T. is to continue to flourish they must have a steady flow of new members. There are no prerequisites of any kind to membership and the particular field in which a member may end up working is usually determined strictly by his or her own taste and talent. The need for new blood has led G.L.T. into mounting an ambitious membership drive before the start of the 73-74 season. Publicity flyers in the form of season programs, and containing explanations of the group and its work etc are being widely distributed. These programs also contain membership and ticket application forms.
Should anyone with a tentative interest in theatre wish a taste of the group's work before committing to membership, G.L.T. is having a series of informal play readings where members get together as a group to read and discuss plays and their production.
