Sisters on pipes, drums compete at CNE contest

It was sister against sister when the International Pipe Band Championships were held Sunday at CNE Stadium in Toronto. Sisters Gail Brown, 19, and Anne Brown, 17, were playing in competing bands during the event.

Gail is a pipe who is spending this summer with the Shotts and Dykehead Caledonia Pipe Band in Lanarkshire, Scotland. They came to Canada to participate in the Scottish World Festival Tattoo, featured at the evening grandstand show Wednesday to Sunday of last week. One of the bands competing in the same category in the daytime competitions was the Waterloo Regional Police Band, in which Anne is a drummer.

The Red Hackle Pipes and Drums from Scotland won Sunday's grade one band championship, while Shotts and Dykehead Caledonia came second. Anne's band, Waterloo, was 11th of the 25 bands in that class of the contest.

Only girls Both girls have the distinction being the only female member in their respective bands.

Not only is Gail the only girl in the Scottish band, she's the first woman to ever play with the band in its 63 years of history. Earlier this summer Shotts and Dykehead won the World Championship at Ayr, Scotland.

Although she was supposed to spend the whole summer in Scotland with the band, when the band came to Canada for the CNE performances Gail found time to slip home and visit her parents Mr. and Mrs. Norman Brown on Five Sideroad, Esquimaux. She brought along her new fiance, a drummer in the Scottish band, and several of the Shotts and Dykehead bandmen also paid a visit to the Browns' home.

Big thrill Gail has been piping since she was seven. Anne just took up the tenor drum nine months ago and has played with the Waterloo band for the past month. Anne said the competition at the CNE was great experience but it was even more thrilling to play in the massed bands tattoo in the CNE stadium, one of a cast of 1,500 in the tattoo that played to packed audiences all four evenings.

Shotts and Dykehead band returned to Scotland Monday night and Gail flew back with them. There are still a couple more championship competitions before their busy summer comes to an end.

Expect 3,200 at Sheridan

More than 3,200 full-time day students are expected to register at Sheridan College in September—a 20 to 25 per cent increase over last year, said Dean John Bromley.

He told the Sheridan Board of Governors in Oakville last week that 2,300 will be new students and the remainder will be returning second and third year students.

Confirmations (students who pay a \$35 deposit) are up 28.7 per cent from 1972.

Bromley termed the enrolment projection as "very encouraging and well beyond the budgeted figures". Each division (there are nine post-secondary areas) is projecting an increase in registered students.

The projection excludes the School of Nursing which transfers to Sheridan effective Sept. 1. Another 235 Students are expected to enrol at the Credit Valley Campus; 150 of which will be new registrants.

Registration will be held at the respective day-time campuses during the week of Sept. 4. Divisional college representatives, members of the Registrar's Office and college counsellors will be on hand to assist new students with program selections.

In order to handle the 500 additional students this year, a number of portable classrooms have been added to the campuses and renovations are underway to provide extra classroom space.

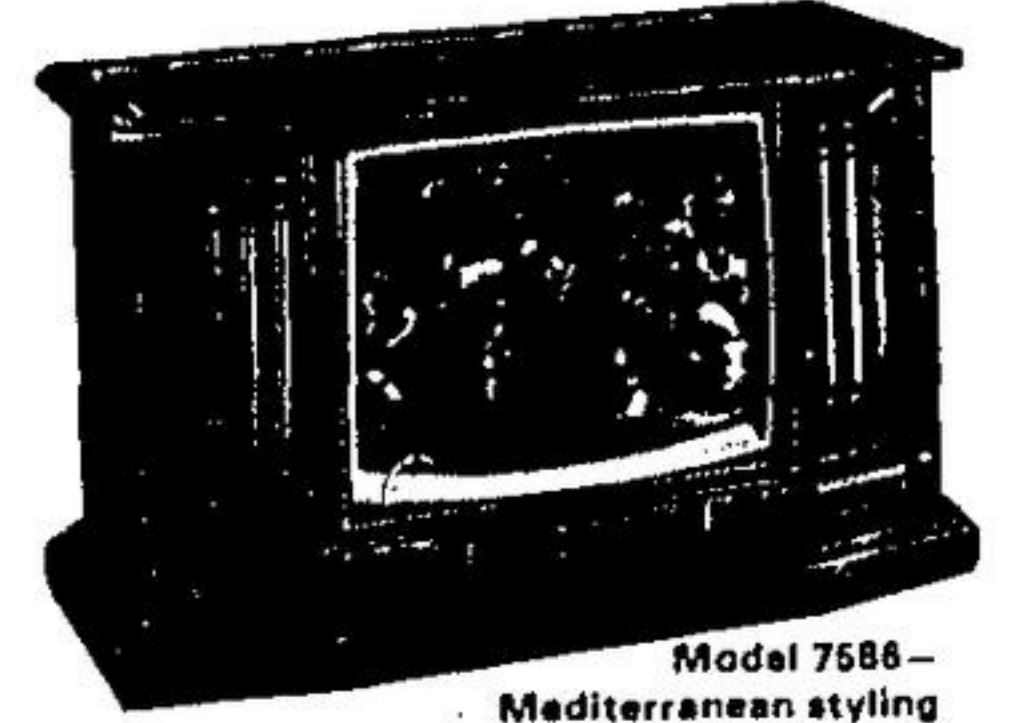

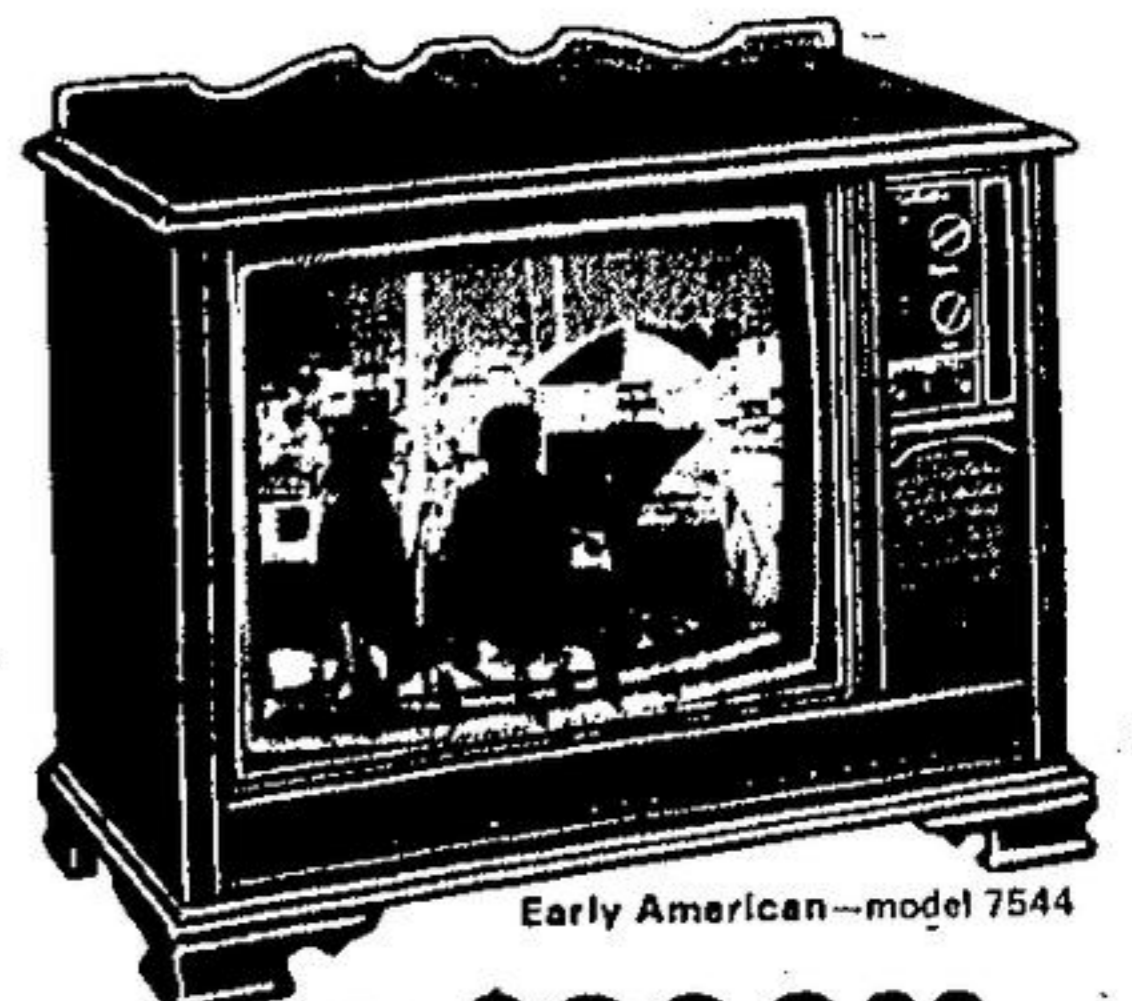

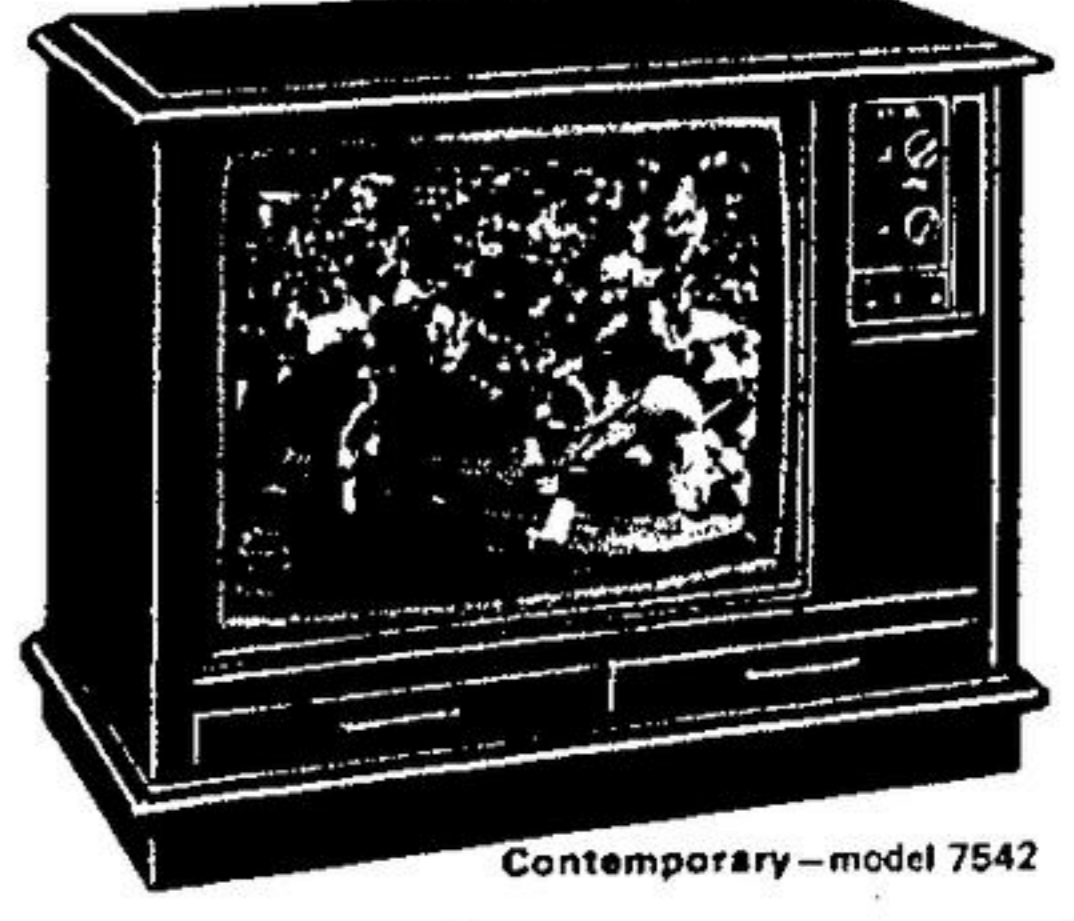
