

Peewees win 'burg tourney

Hot dogs, corn on the cob and pop were served to players at lunch time. Umpires for the day were Roy Swan and Bill Lee.

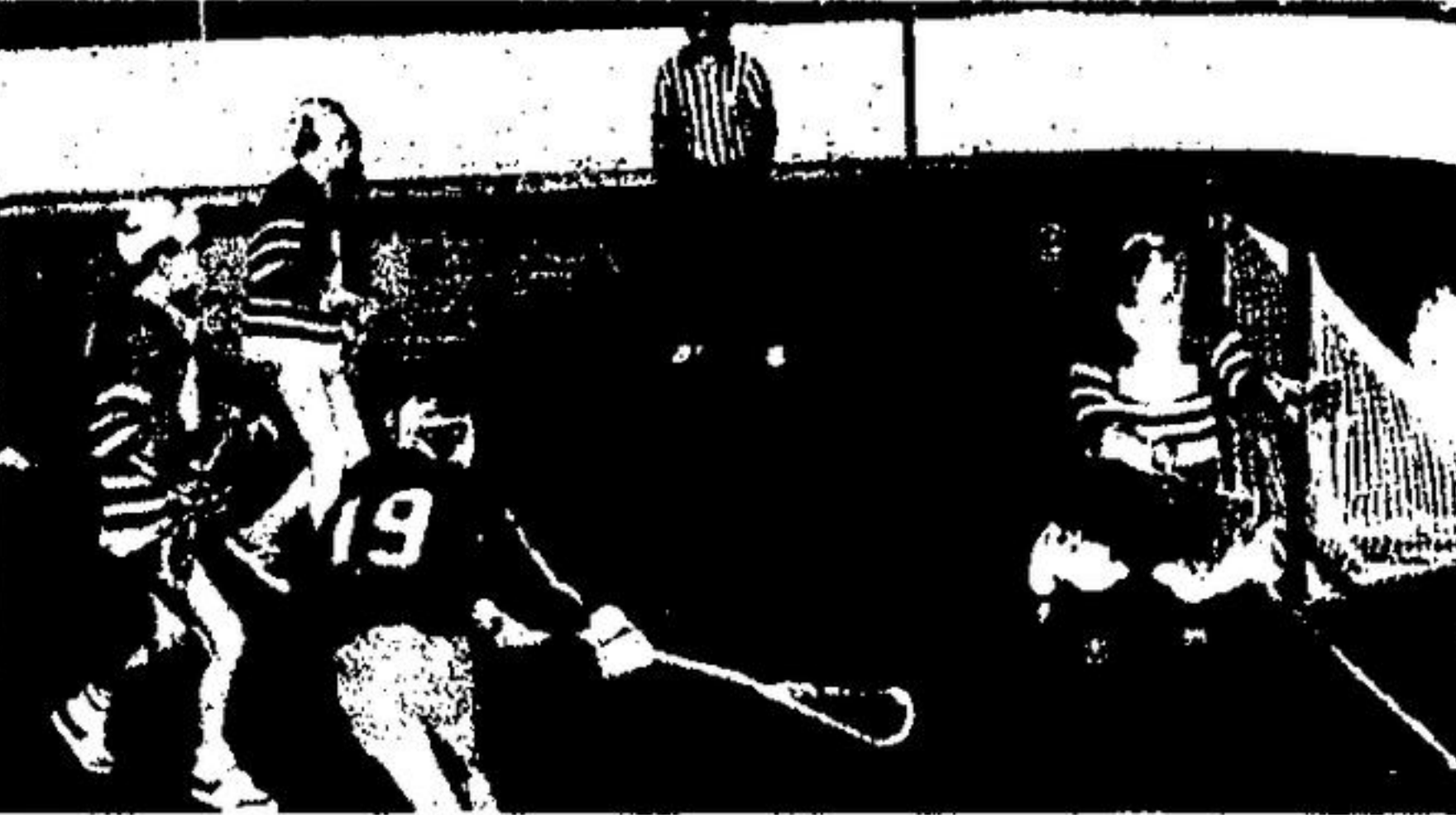
