Ontario Hydro is launching the next stage of its study of the location of two rights-ofway for 500,000-volt (500 Kv) power lines between Bradley Junction and the Guelph-Acton-Georgetown area to accommodate part of a province-wide bulk transmission system. The location of this north-south corridor will vitally affect the Rockwood-Acton area.

This stage consists of a series of 10 public meetings in October throughout the 3,000 square mile study area. At these meetings a number of broad corridors or continuous paths of least environmental impact through which the 500 Ky system could be routed will be discussed. Bradley Junction is the terminus for the Bruce generating station.

Data from all these steps has been co-ordinated and Hydro has now identified areas that can be eliminated from further consideration because they posed "major difficulties in preserving the natural environment, or maintaining compatibility with man's present, planned and potential land use.


