Esqueusing vote split on private road gravel

A Local Initiatives Program grant for improving roads will be sought by R.R. 1 Georgetown residents. Lou Hogue and Nick Hunsley of R.R. 1, Georgetown, appeared before Esqueusing council Monday night to explain their proposal. They are making application for an LIP grant of \$75,000 to improve six private roads—Starks Rd., Johnson Rd., Bennett Place, Leslie Hill, Brick Kiln Rd. and Mullin Dr. They said about 50 to 55 homes are affected in the area, behind the Park Toyota on Highway No. 7. They have previously sought road improvements from the township without success. Raising and graveling of the roads would be done. The LIP grant, if approved, would not be available until the new year.

Train whistles

An anti-whistling bylaw, to apply to two railway crossings in Esqueusing township, has been referred to the new regional council.

Monday night Esqueusing council read a letter from the Canadian Transport Commission containing a draft form of a possible bylaw which would be acceptable to their committee. With little discussion, council referred the matter to the new council.

Inspection of level crossings had been requested by letter in December 1972 and at a meeting in September. The letter indicated the report of the investigation has been filed and it is the recommendation of the committee's district transportation officer assigned to the case that the two level crossings—(Halton county road (Trafalgar Road) and Esqueusing township road No. 17, are protected to the satisfaction of the committee for the purpose of approving an anti-whistling bylaw.
