

## Turk may beat Razor's record

Gary Turkosz could surpass Ray Evans as Acton Sabres' all-time scoring leader this weekend.

Turk picked up four goals and two assists in Sabres' opening games against Alliston, giving him a total of 42 goals and 32 assists for 74 points in his two years-plus of Sabre service.

Evans counted 82 points (34 goals and 48 assists) in one season to league the lead in

1971-72.

He played first base this summer for the O.B.A. Intermediate "B" champion Campbellville Merchants and is now with the Intermediate "A" Georgetown Raiders who are seeking their third consecutive O.B.A. championship.

Turk is the only player who has played in every Sabre game, since the team's inception.
