# New addition at Ballinafad United Church

Benefits of a new addition to Ballinafad church will be most appreciated when the church ladies prepare the annual turkey dinner next week. The church has been a focal point of the community for decades. A short history has been written by Mrs. H. Shorthill, the first parts of it from notes compiled by the late Bea Hills.  
 Books and records of Ballinafad church were destroyed by fire when in 1912 the house of Mr. and Mrs. Robt. Aikett burned. Mr. Aikett having been secretary, a full account of the church up until that time is not available. According to notes by the late Miss Hills this (Presbyterian) church was built in 1878 and opened on Oct. 20.  
 This first ordained minister was Rev. Dobson, next Rev. Kay followed by Rev. Ames, Rev. D.L. Campbell, Rev. George Milne, Rev. Currie and in 1916 Rev. Nathan Waddell. Mr. Waddell was minister when church union began.  
 The first elders were John Russell, James Marshall and George Yeman. Others who followed in groups of three: Donald McLean, Robt Aikett, James McMurchie, Richard Burnside, David Russell, George Rossel.  
 On July 15, 1912 at the home of Mrs. Dan Campbell, (town line) the sessions of Ballinafad and Melville held

on joint meeting which was opened with prayer by the moderator, Rev. J.L. Thompson of Cheltenham. It must have been decided then that these two charges would be affiliated and until the Melville church was closed they were.  
 Going back, up until 1878 Presbyterians had used the Methodist church across the way.  
 When in 1878 they decided to build they procured a site from Mr. David Hill and built it.  
 A Mr. White M.P. had the honor of laying the corner stone. Neighbouring ministers, Rev. Fowle of Erin being one, had charge of the impressive service.  
 Communion  
 The pastor and session of Melville church officiated at the first communion service because Melville was getting a start the Toronto Presbytery looked after pulpit supplies.  
 A few years later the congregation decided to procure a home for their minister, so bought the house and property which later was known as the Manse. (The question is was the property bought with the house on it or did they build it?)  
 Union  
 In 1925 when church union took place the Methodist church no longer was used.  
 Down through the years our church has been a centre of activities and improvements.

A shed for horses etc was built on extra land acquired. In 1954 a basement was excavated under the church and the floor of the main building raised. Improvements to the chancel were made, a kitchen with cupboards and plumbing.  
 Some years previous Hydro had been installed. The expense for this installation of electricity was met by an elder, the late D.J. Sinclair.  
 A furnace was put in to replace the two stoves at the back. Later an electric organ was purchased.  
 Building fund  
 When the manse was sold to Mr. and Mrs. Snider the proceeds of said sale were put in a fund, which Presbytery stipulated could only be used for a building fund. This year the congregation decided the money be put to erecting more adequate kitchen facilities. This has now been completed, and presents a very attractive addition to our church property.  
 On Sunday October 28 the dedication took place with Rev. Stiles officiating along with members of the session
