Esquesing council notes

At its last meeting Monday Esquesing council dealt with a wide range of matters. The meeting was unusually long.

Acting as court of revision council wrote off or refunded taxes totalling \$3939.37. Several of those appealing were present but were satisfied with the decisions recommended.

Councillors questioned why Toronto Camping Service should pay school rate only on the property at Norval, formerly the Y camp.

Representing the township planners M. M. Dillon Ltd. John Farrow brought councillors 10 copies of their new zoning bylaw Monday. They were adopted by bylaw and duly signed. The plan must be approved by the O.M.B. hopefully by June.

Council also ordered 100 more copies of the official plan at \$700. Clerk Delmar French estimated there are a couple of requests a week from people who want to buy them.

Craig Royce appeared before Esquesing council concerning his application for rezoning for a garage at Drumquin. He has been waiting over a year. "We've been just as discouraged as you," commented Reeve Hill. Council supports his application.

The clerk held up a sheaf of papers he had been asked to fill out at once to determine capital forecasts. "No way," he declared.

Thanks was expressed to Dorothy Stone for lettering township certificates of appreciation.

fownship men will erect a fence at the Odorico property on the sixth line, as required in an agreement of sale. Ray Odorico had purchased the McBride farm. The council had thought the township was only required to fence part of the property.

The Georgetown fire department monthly report was received.

Milton fire department reported a deficit of \$5,000 and Esquesing will be requisitioned for 14.75 per cent of this. This is only their second deficit since 1957.

Grayton Golden Kennels, R.R. 1, Acton, applied for a permit for a dog kennel. Mrs. Gray was to be informed council hasn't been issuing licenses but she is free to purchase dog tags.

Since the province assumed the function of construction safety in August, the county refunded Esquesing part of its share of the full amount which had been requisitioned. A cheque in the amount of \$1,432.86 has been "received, banked and spent", the clerk told council.

An additional \$75,000 has been received by the town-ship for construction subsidy. Councillor Howitt and the reeve had met with Ministry representatives seeking the funds. It's less than requested, but will help delray the extra burden placed on the township by the failure of the structure on the Sixth Line at Oakville creek.

School board member Bill Lawson expressed his appreciation to council for co-operation over the years, and especially to former clerk K. C. Lindsay.

Accounts were paid and annual payment made to councillors, reeve, and board members.
