Amendment No. Seven to the Official Plan of the Acton Planning Area for the property on the west side of Main St. North opposite the Wallace St. entrance to the Industrial Park. This Lot formerly owned by Mr. Kamberlan now owned by Mr. Mogens Toff.

1. PURPOSE AND BASIS OF THE AMENDMENT

This Amendment is the result of an application made by the owner of the lands affected by the Amendment whereby the owner has requested permission to change the use from those permitted in an Industrial - Light M1 Zone as provided under Restricted Area By-law No. 1358, as amended, to one or more of those uses permitted in a Residential R2 Zone.

In view of the fact that the intended change of land use will be toward a permitted use more

PURPOSE


