Tip (A) in a new series on painting

- When should you paint?
1. It is generally recommended that you should repaint interior walls and trim every 3 to 4 years.
 2. Also, check from time to time for cracking, blistering or chipping. Keep in mind that these conditions are not always due to paint failure. They may indicate structural defects which should be remedied before repainting.
 3. To ensure satisfactory service from your finish, clean surfaces well every 1 or 1 1/2 years.
 4. Always use Beaver brand finishes, and watch for more tips in the series on painting in the near future.
