Vikings ready

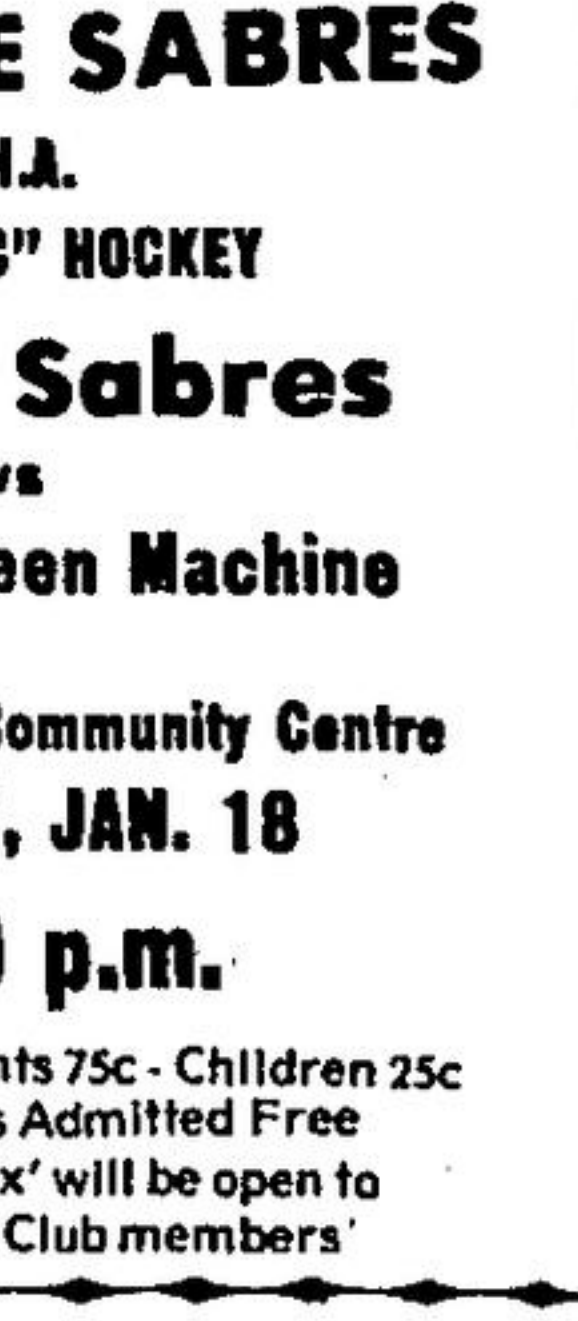
Robert Little Vikings, the defending North Halton champions scored a pair of exhibition basketball victories over their crosstown rivals M. Z. Bennett Marauders last week.
