handyman tips Home Carpet Care

Even with the best daily care, a carpet can become dull. Professional cleaning is recommended. However, the following method for home carpet care is suggested:

1. Always test your carpet for colour fastness in a hidden area.
2. Vacuum your carpet thoroughly.
3. Into a pint of lukewarm water stir 1 tablespoon of a neutral powdered

4. laundry detergent and 1 teaspoon of vinegar. Shake well.
4. Using a gentle rotary motion, apply the solution sparingly to the carpet pile with a sponge.
5. Rinse the sponge in clean water, squeeze dry and sponge the carpet again to remove as much of the detergent as possible. Blot up any excess moisture with a dry cloth.
6. Dry the carpet as quickly as possible. Fans or heaters will help.
7. Avoid excessive wetting and do not replace furniture until dry.
