

If your walls are really level and flat (test this with a plumb line) it is possible for you to apply your new paneling directly to the existing wall process. Remember, see BEAVER surfaces. This operation can be for all you paneling needs! done by either using a panel

adhesive, or by nailing (use coloured nails to match panel). If the walls have minor rough spots, simply lightly sand such areas to a smooth finish. 2.
