Group forms

Claiming they need a strong voice in Nassagaweya, 10 residents last week met at the home of Don Duke to discuss the formation of a northwest Halton ratepayer group.

A meeting has been called for Feb. 20 in Brookville Hall at 8 p.m. Flyers are being drawn up by the organizers and will be mailed out to the 3,200 residents of Nassagaweya. Membership is to cost \$2.

Suggestions made at the initial meeting as to the aims of the group included the protection of the quality of life and the environment, protecting the interests of the ratepayer, and keeping out the quarries and the dump.

The main function according to Mr. Duke would be to have representatives attend council meetings to watch for issues affecting their area and to make presentations to government groups.

Membership structure of the proposed organization would be to have a chairman, vice-chairman, secretary-treasurer and a steering committee of volunteers. Elections will be held at the Feb. 20 meeting.

Gus Goutouski, one of the organizers, pointed out the need for membership from the people who have been in the area for a number of years as well as newcomers. "They have as much to lose as any of us," he explained, "with regional government we need a strong voice from the rural area of Milton."

Representatives on council have not been specifically invited to attend the initial meeting but will get a notice the same as all ratepayers. Organizers have for the time being named the proposed organization, Nassagaweya Area Residents Association.

Death natural

The death of Milton's assistant town clerk Syd Savage last week was due to "natural causes", a spokesman for Milton OPP reports.

Mr. Savage was found dead in his northern Nassagaweya home, where he lived alone, on Tuesday afternoon of last week by a co-worker. He had not turned up for work for two days and an employee was sent to his home to check, because Mr. Savage had no telephone. It is believed he died on Sunday, Jan. 20.

Funeral service was held Saturday at Sarina. He is survived by a son John, a sister and two brothers, all of Sarina.

He had been assistant clerk of Milton since the first of the year and had been a Nassagaweya employee six years prior to that. Mr. Savage had worked for Nassagaweya Township since 1967 as zoning administrator, secretary to the planning board and committee of adjustment, welfare administrator, building inspector and assistant to the clerk before eventually being named township clerk last July.

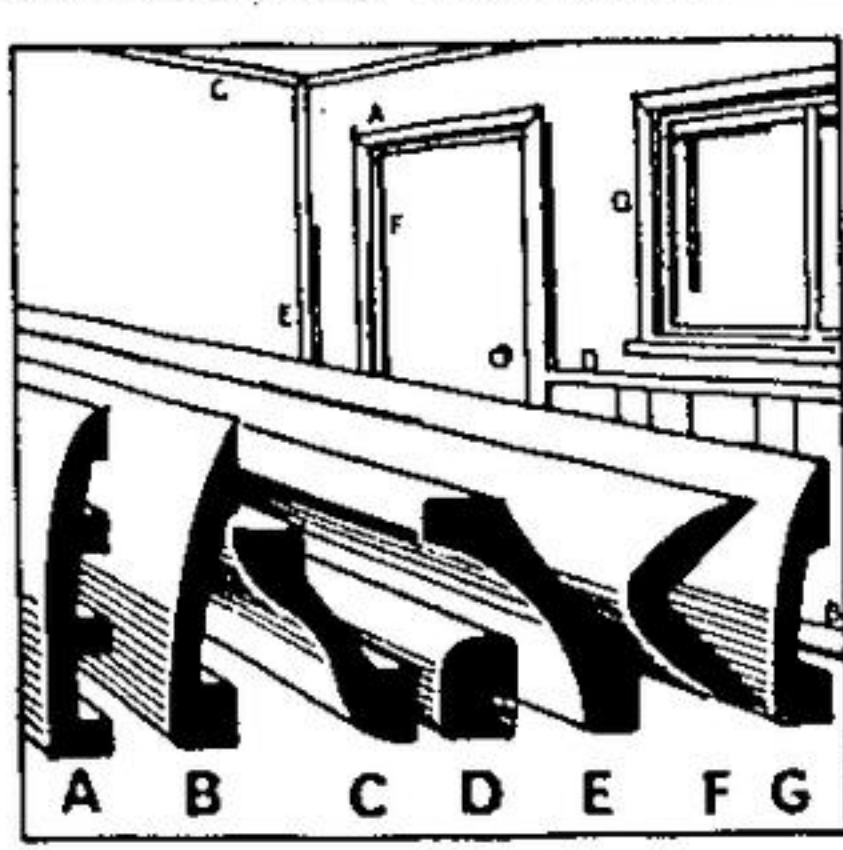

handyman tip

Prepare to panel:

Here's the 2nd. In-depth tip on paneling. Read them all. 1. Remove all old mouldings. 2. Inspect the wall surfaces. If your walls are really level and flat (test this with a plumb line) it is possible for you to apply your new paneling directly to the existing wall surfaces. This operation can be done by either using a panel

adhesive, or by nailing (use coloured nails to match panel). If the walls have minor rough spots, simply lightly sand such areas to a smooth finish. 2. If your walls appear to be quite uneven, you will have to apply wood strapping. Strapping is strips of lumber nailed across the wall to ensure an even surface for adhesion of the paneling. NO. 3 in this series will continue on with this process. Remember, see BEAVER for all you paneling needs!
