### Top truckers

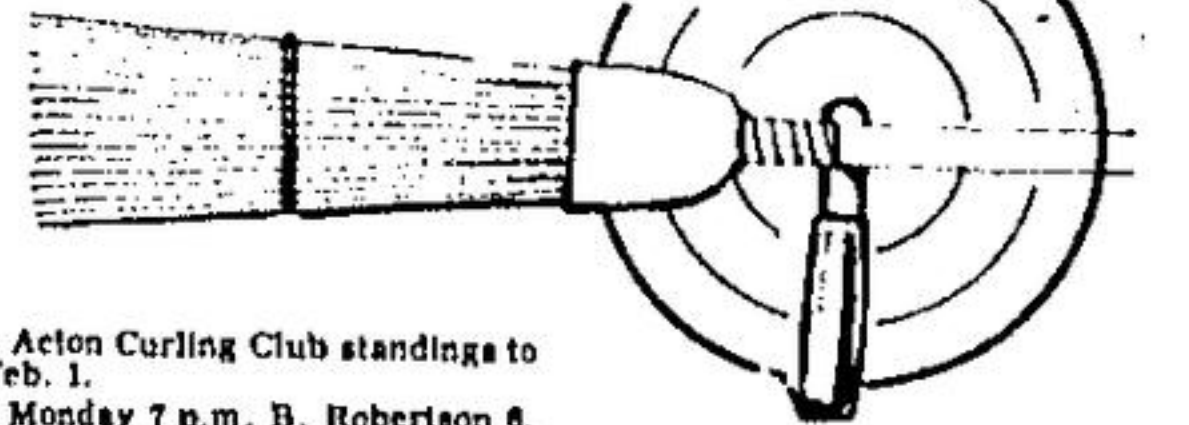
